Day 1: V Defining True Love

- John 15:13 NIV "Greater love has no one than this: to lay down one's life for one's friends."
- Ephesians 4:2 NIV "Be completely humble and gentle; be patient, bearing with one another in love."







#### Devotional: Understanding Love Beyond Feelings

What is true love according to the Bible? Today we begin with the classic definition in 1 Corinthians 13, often called the 'love chapter.' It speaks not about feelings but about actions: love is patient and kind, it does not envy or boast, and it always protects and trusts.

True love goes beyond attraction. It's intentional, sacrificial, and respectful. For teens experiencing the stirrings of affection, it can be tempting to confuse physical attraction with love. But Scripture teaches that love is a choice to seek the good of the other person, often putting their needs before your own.

Think of love like a strong foundation—it takes time and commitment to build, but once established, it supports everything else. As John 15:13 reminds us, the greatest love is sacrificial love, even to the point of laying down one's life. While this might seem extreme for young relationships, the heart of the message is clear: love values the other more than self.

As you reflect today, ask yourself how you can begin cultivating love that is patient, kind, and humble, rather than rushing headfirst into feelings alone.

## Devotional: Identifying and Overcoming Lust

Lust is a powerful and dangerous temptation for many teens. Unlike love, which builds up and respects, lust reduces the other person to a physical object for immediate gratification. Jesus' words in Matthew 5:28 remind us that lust begins in the heart and mind, making it a serious matter not to be dismissed.

James warns that temptation comes from our own desires pulling us away from God's way. It's easy to justify lustful thoughts or actions, especially when surrounded by media and culture that promote them. But these desires can quickly lead to hurt, guilt, and broken relationships.

Choosing to walk by the Spirit means inviting God's presence to transform your thoughts and desires. Instead of letting lust control you, rely on God to renew your mind, giving you strength to honor both yourself and others as valuable creations made in His image.

Today, consider where lust might be trying to take hold in your life. Recognizing it early is the first step in choosing purity and godliness.

## Devotional: The Power of Purity and Waiting

Choosing purity is a powerful act of obedience and faith in God's promises. 1 Thessalonians 4 calls us to sanctification—being set apart for holiness by controlling our bodies in honorable ways. For teens feeling pressure to give in to physical desires, this can feel challenging, but God's will is for your good.

Patience plays a crucial role here. Hebrews reminds us that perseverance in doing God's will will lead to receiving His promises. Waiting may be hard, but it aligns your heart with God's perfect timing and purpose.

Patience doesn't mean passivity; it means trustfully guarding your heart and choices while God prepares what is best for you. Psalm 37 encourages stillness and trust, even when others take different paths or seem to have success through shortcuts.

As you embrace purity and patience today, recognize it as a bold stand that honors God and your future relationships. Purity is not about limitation, but about the freedom to love deeply and purely when the right time arrives.
