Ephesians 5 calls husbands to love their wives as Christ loved the church — selflessly and wholly.

Even in difficulty, gratitude changes our perspective and invites peace. Paul encourages believers to give thanks in all circumstances, not because hardship is good but because God's presence is always trustworthy.

Couples who focus on blessings uphold hope and joy. Reflecting together on what is still good nurtures mutual encouragement and grace.

Today, make space to acknowledge God's goodness and express thankfulness as a spiritual practice that strengthens your marriage.
