Devotional: Patience as the Heart of Leadership

Devotional: Choosing Words That Build Up

Words carry immense power in leadership. The Bible likens **gracious words** to honey that is sweet and healing. Every conversation is an opportunity to encourage, instruct, and build others up or, conversely, tear down and discourage.

James encourages us to exhibit heavenly wisdom marked by mercy and sincerity, while Ephesians commands that our speech be helpful and uplifting to meet others' needs. Managing people with patience and grace requires careful, intentional speech that reflects God's love.

Sometimes harsh words stem from frustration, but leadership marked by grace restrains the tongue, choosing kindness even when it's hard. Speak words that inspire confidence, foster peace, and shape character. Today, be mindful of your speech and ask God to align your words with His truth and love.
