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Introduction

Devotional: Inviting the Spirit to Guide Our Marriage

Day 3: O Spirit-Led Communication

Devotional: Letting the Spirit Shape Our Words

Communication is vital in marriage, and it is often where conflict arises. The Holy Spirit can transform the way couples speak and listen to each other, fostering understanding and peace.

Spirit-led communication involves humility to listen more than speak, gentleness to respond without harshness, and wisdom to choose words that build up rather than tear down. It means being sensitive to the Spirit's prompting, pausing before responding, and seeking reconciliation over winning arguments.

Ask the Spirit to teach you both how to communicate with grace and truth today. Practice listening deeply, praying before conversations, and choosing words that reflect God's love and patience. Your marriage will grow stronger as you walk in the Spirit's wisdom in your dialogue.

- Matthew 18:21–22 "I tell you, not seven times, but seventy-seven times."







Day 4: T Spirit Empowered Forgiveness

Devotional: Forgiving Through the Spirit's Strength

Forgiveness is essential in marriage but often difficult without supernatural strength. The Holy Spirit empowers spouses to forgive repeatedly, just as Christ has forgiven us infinitely.

When wrongs happen, holding onto bitterness or resentment can poison love and create distance. But the Spirit prompts us to release hurt, seek reconciliation, and restore peace. Forgiveness is not always a feeling but a choice made through the Spirit's power.

Today, reflect on areas where forgiveness is needed, either to give or to seek. Ask the Spirit to soften your heart and grant you the grace to forgive fully. Embrace the freedom and healing that come through Spirit-led forgiveness as a foundation for a healthy, thriving marriage.

Devotional: Spirit-Led Growth in Marriage
