#### Devotional: Embracing Your Secure Identity in Christ

When a person knows they are complete in Christ—whole and cherished—they bring strength, peace, and grace into the marriage relationship. This security allows couples to support one another freely without fear or insecurity.

Today, focus on resting deeply in the identity Christ has given you, independent of any human role or relationship. Celebrate the freedom and newness that 2 Corinthians 5:17 declares. Your value is not dependent on your spouse but is grounded eternally in Jesus. This truth liberates you to love healthier and live fully as part of a unified couple.

# Devotional: Receiving God's Grace Brings Peace and Acceptance

#### Devotional: God's Power Shines in Our Weakness Daily

# Devotional: Truth and Love: Foundations for Healthy Communication
