## Devotional: Discover Strength in the Threefold Cord

**Ecclesiastes 4:12** gives us a vivid picture of what marriage can be when Christ is included. Imagine two strands representing husband and wife—each strong in their own right. Alone, they can face challenges, but when intertwined with Christ, the third strand, the cord becomes nearly unbreakable.

What does it mean practically to have Christ as that third strand? It begins with humility and patience, as Paul encourages in **Ephesians 4:2–3**. When trials strike or misunderstandings arise, leaning on Christ means we extend grace and forgiveness because He has modeled this for us. Similarly, **Colossians 3:14** reminds us that love is the glue binding all virtues in perfect unity.

Today, reflect on the current state of your marriage. Are you relying on your own strength, or are you inviting Christ to steady and strengthen your bond continually? Christ invests strength beyond human ability, weaving a tapestry of love that sustains against every storm.
