# Marriage: Overcoming Seasons of Distance



A 7-day journey to restore connection in marriage through Scripture and prayer during times of emotional or physical distance.





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#### Introduction

Marriage is a sacred union designed by God to bring intimacy, companionship, and mutual support. Yet, every marriage faces seasons where emotional or physical distance can create barriers between spouses. These times of disconnection may arise from busy schedules, conflicts, unmet expectations, or life's storms. During such moments, couples can feel isolated and distant, longing to draw near but unsure how to bridge the gap.

This Bible study plan is created for couples or individuals seeking to overcome these seasons of distance. Across seven days, we will explore God's Word to understand His design for marriage, identify the roots of disconnection, and discover the spiritual practices that enable healing and reconnection. Through Scripture, devotional reflections, and prayer, you will be encouraged to take intentional steps toward intimacy, forgiveness, and renewed closeness with your spouse.

Distance in marriage challenges the heart but also opens opportunities for growth and transformation. The Lord promises to be near to the brokenhearted and to heal relationships when we seek Him with humility. You will find practical insights on communication, patience, love, and grace—all grounded in biblical truth. Let this time be a sacred pause, a moment to realign your marriage with God's design and reignite the warmth of your bond.







With open hearts and eyes fixed on God's promises, you can move from isolation to intimacy. Each day offers scripture to meditate on, reflections to inspire, journaling to process your journey, and prayers to invite God's presence. May you experience the tender work of God's Spirit drawing you and your spouse near again, restoring joy and unity.















#### Your Verse

James 4:8 NIV - "Come near to God and he will come near to you. Wash your hands, you sinners, and purify your hearts, you double-minded."

#### **Supporting Scriptures**

- Psalm 34:18 "The LORD is close to the brokenhearted and saves those who are crushed in spirit."
- Ecclesiastes 4:9 "Two are better than one, because they have a good return for their labor."







#### Devotional: Draw Near to God First for Healing

Distance in marriage often begins before it becomes obvious. Emotional walls can rise slowly, and physical separation can grow unnoticed. The first step to overcoming this distance is recognizing it honestly and turning our hearts back toward God.

James 4:8 invites us with a beautiful promise—when we take the initiative to draw near to God, He will draw near to us. This is the foundation for healing any broken relationship. As we seek God's presence, He begins to purify our hearts and open our eyes to the needs within the marriage.

Sometimes we feel stuck in distance because we focus solely on the other person's faults. Yet healing requires us to examine our own hearts and humble ourselves before God. Psalm 34:18 reminds us that God is especially close to those who feel broken or crushed. He understands our struggles and offers comfort and restoration.

Lastly, Ecclesiastes 4:9 teaches us that partnership is valuable and beneficial. God created marriage for mutual support, strength, and joy. When distance threatens, returning to God together strengthens the foundation of your relationship.

Take a moment to honestly reflect on where distance exists in your marriage. Invite God to come near to you first, so He can lead you back toward your spouse. Healing always flows from God's presence in our hearts.

Day 2: The Power of Communication and Listening

#### Your Verse

James 1:19 NIV – "My dear brothers and sisters, take note of this: Everyone should be quick to listen, slow to speak and slow to become angry."

#### **Supporting Scriptures**

- Proverbs 15:1 "A gentle answer turns away wrath, but a harsh word stirs up anger."
- Ephesians 4:29 "Do not let any unwholesome talk come out of your mouths, but only what is helpful for building others up."







Day 2: The Power of Communication and Listening

#### Devotional: Listen First, Speak with Grace

Distance often grows when communication breaks down. When spouses stop truly listening or respond with defensiveness, walls go up and misunderstandings multiply. God's Word provides clear guidance on how to communicate with love and patience.

James 1:19 is a powerful reminder to be quick to listen, slow to speak, and slow to anger. Being a good listener requires humility and attentiveness. It means setting aside our desire to prove a point or defend ourselves, instead valuing our spouse's feelings and perspectives.

Proverbs 15:1 tells us that gentle answers can diffuse anger, while harsh words escalate conflict. Choosing kindness in our speech opens doors for healing rather than driving wedges further.

Paul's exhortation in Ephesians 4:29 encourages us to build up rather than tear down with our words. Even when addressing hard issues, the goal is restoration—not destruction.

Today, create space to listen deeply to your spouse. Pray for a loving heart and words that bring life. Practice patience and gentleness, trusting that God will use your humble communication to close the distance.

#### Your Verse

Colossians 3:13 NIV - "Bear with each other and forgive one another if any of you has a grievance against someone. Forgive as the Lord forgave you."

#### **Supporting Scriptures**

- Ephesians 4:32 "Be kind and compassionate to one another, forgiving each other, just as in Christ God forgave you."
- Matthew 6:14 "For if you forgive other people when they sin against you, your heavenly Father will also forgive you."







#### Devotional: Forgive as God Forgave You

Distance is often fueled by unresolved hurts and unforgiveness. When offenses remain in the heart, bitterness can grow strong walls between spouses. God calls us to forgive as He has forgiven us, inviting freedom and restoration to our relationships.

Colossians 3:13 urges us to bear with one another patiently and forgive grievances wholeheartedly. Forgiveness isn't always easy—it requires surrendering pride and choosing love over hurt. Yet, it reflects the very character of God, whose mercy and grace are limitless.

Ephesians 4:32 reminds us of the kindness and compassion that should mark our marriages. Forgiveness heals wounds and paves the way for deeper trust.

Jesus Himself taught in Matthew 6:14 the importance of forgiveness, linking it to experiencing God's forgiveness personally. Holding on to hurt not only damages marriage but blocks our communion with God.

Take time today to prayerfully consider any hurts you need to release. Ask God for the strength to forgive, and seek reconciliation with your spouse. Healing comes when grace flows freely in both directions.

#### **Journaling Prompts**

1.	Write about a time forgiveness brought healing in your relationship.
2.	List attitudes or fears that make forgiving difficult for you.
3.	Pray for God's compassion and ability to forgive as He does.







#### **Prayer for Today**

Heavenly Father, forgive me for holding onto bitterness or hurt in my marriage. Help me to extend the same grace and mercy to my spouse that You lavish on me. Soften my heart to forgive fully and freely. Restore what has been damaged and heal our wounds through Your love. May forgiveness bring us closer to one another and to You. In Jesus' name, Amen.

#### Your Verse

Proverbs 3:5 NIV - "Trust in the LORD with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding;"

#### **Supporting Scriptures**

- Psalm 118:8 "It is better to take refuge in the LORD than to trust in humans."
- 1 Corinthians 13:7 "Love always protects, always trusts, always hopes, always perseveres."







Day 4: 🂢 Rebuilding Trust Step by Step

#### Devotional: Trust God While Healing Together

Distance in marriage can shatter trust, making connection feel fragile or unsafe. Rebuilding trust requires patience, transparency, and reliance on God's wisdom rather than our limited understanding.

Proverbs 3:5 challenges us to trust fully in the Lord and not lean on our own perspective. When hurt clouds our judgment or hope dims, turning to God provides clarity and strength to move forward.

Psalm 118:8 reminds us that trusting God is wiser than placing ultimate confidence in people—even those we love. Surrendering control to Him helps heal broken trust over time.

1 Corinthians 13:7 describes love as protective and persevering, including its choice to trust and hope in the face of challenges. Practicing these virtues nurtures trust in marriage slowly but surely.

Today, consider where you struggle with trust. Invite God to help you take small steps toward rebuilding confidence and hope. Commit to openness and consistency, while resting in God's unfailing faithfulness as your foundation.

It always protects, always trusts, always hopes, always perseveres."

#### Supporting Scriptures

- John 15:12 "My command is this: Love each other as I have loved you."
- Romans 13:10 "Love does no harm to a neighbor. Therefore love is the fulfillment of the law."







#### Devotional: Love's Actions Heal and Unite

True love is the foundation of marriage and the ultimate force that draws spouses together. It is expressed through consistent actions that reflect the heart of God.

1 Corinthians 13 beautifully describes love's qualities—patience, kindness, humility, forgiveness, protection, and perseverance. These characteristics are practical expressions of love that heal past wounds and rebuild intimacy.

Jesus commands us in John 15:12 to love one another as He has loved us—selflessly and sacrificially. This kind of love is a daily choice to put your spouse's needs above your own and to celebrate truth and goodness.

Romans 13:10 reminds us that love avoids harm and fulfills God's commandments. When we intentionally cultivate love through actions—small kindnesses, honest words, sacrifices—we create a safe environment where connection thrives.

Today, reflect on how your love can tangibly express God's heart to your spouse. Let your actions be a bridge over the distance and a testimony of His enduring grace.

#### Devotional: Unite Hearts in Prayer and Trust

Prayer is the mighty tool couples can wield to unite their hearts and invite God's presence into their marriage. It opens the door for God to work miracles in reconnection and restoration.

Matthew 18:20 assures us that when we come together in God's name, He is right there with us. This promise encourages couples to pray together regularly—sharing burdens, expressing gratitude, and seeking guidance.

Philippians 4:6 instructs us to present all our anxieties, requests, and thanksgiving to God in prayer, releasing worry and embracing peace.

Finally, 1 Thessalonians 5:17 simply exhorts us to pray continually, cultivating a lifestyle of dependence on God's power rather than our own strength.

Today, commit yourself and your marriage to unity through consistent prayer. Invite your spouse to join you or spend private time seeking God's presence and healing. Prayer connects hearts to God and to each other, breaking through every barrier of distance.
