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Introduction

Over the next seven days, we will explore daily scriptures and reflections that remind us to anchor our hearts in the Savior first. We'll challenge ourselves with questions and journaling to help us apply these truths personally and as a couple. Let this study be a journey—not only toward a stronger marriage but also toward a deeper individual relationship with Jesus Christ. Whether you are newlyweds, married for decades, or even preparing for marriage, may this encourage you to build your couple's identity on the unshakable rock of Christ.

Devotional: Knowing Christ Shapes Who We Are

Before two souls become one in marriage, each must know who they are in Christ. The Apostle Paul reminds us in **Galatians 2:20** that our old self has died and we now live by faith in Jesus. This is not merely spiritual jargon—it's a radical redefinition of identity. It means our worth, purpose, and direction are grounded not in relationships or societal roles but in the transforming work of Christ in us.

Why does this matter for marriage? Because when we recognize our true identity in Christ first, we are less likely to look to our spouse for validation, security, or completeness. Instead, we come to the marriage whole, secure, and ready to give and receive love healthily.

Reflect on your own perception of identity. Are you leaning more on your role as a spouse, or firmly rooted in who Christ says you are? Let today challenge you to prioritize your relationship with Jesus above all else, knowing that this will strengthen every relationship God gives you, especially marriage.

Day 2: Preedom in Christ

Devotional: Freedom Empowers Us to Love Fully

Marriage thrives best when both partners understand the freedom they have in Christ. **Romans 8:1** assures us there is no condemnation for those who belong to Jesus. This freedom isn't just legal freedom from sin's penalty but emotional and spiritual freedom from shame, fear, and insecurity.

When you know Christ has freed you, you no longer carry heavy burdens of past mistakes or guilt into your marriage. This spiritual liberty empowers you to love your spouse with a generous, forgiving heart free from judgment. It also frees you from trying to control or possess your partner since your security is based on God's grace.

Reflect on how Christ's freedom influences your emotional health. Are there areas where you feel bound by fear, insecurity, or guilt? Surrender those areas to Jesus today, trusting His grace to heal and restore. Freedom in Christ allows you to show up in marriage as your best, authentic self.

Day 3: **(**) Strength in Weakness

Devotional: Christ's Strength Completes Our Weakness

Marriage often reveals our weaknesses—moments when we fall short, feel vulnerable, or fail each other. Yet, Paul's words in **2 Corinthians 12:9** remind us that God's power shines brightest in our weakness. Rather than hiding or denying our shortcomings, we bring them humbly before Christ and find His grace abounding.

Understanding that our strength comes from God frees us from selfcondemnation and selfish pride. It allows us to depend on Him and each other in honest and tender ways. This kind of vulnerability creates deeper intimacy in marriage because it invites God's power into our relationship.

Consider how admitting weakness in your personal walk and relationship might lead to greater spiritual and emotional health. Are you willing to rely more on God's strength today instead of your own? Embracing this truth strengthens your identity in Christ and strengthens your marriage.

- John 15:13 "Greater love has no one than this: to lay down one's life for one's friends."







Devotional: Modeling Christ's Sacrificial Love

Christ's love for the church is the gold standard for marriage love. When Paul instructs husbands to love as Christ loved, he points us to a love marked by sacrifice, humility, and selflessness (**Ephesians 5:25**). This kind of love is rooted in knowing Christ's identity and living out that love daily.

To love sacrificially means prioritizing your spouse's well-being, forgiveness, and growth, not as an obligation but from a heart transformed by Christ. This love is patient during difficulties, kind in words and actions, and persevering through trials.

Reflect on how your understanding of Christ's love impacts your marriage. Do you love conditionally or sacrificially? As you grow in your identity in Him, you'll discover the depth of love that can transform your relationship into a reflection of His grace and truth.

Devotional: Foundations Firm in Christ

Jesus teaches that the wise build their lives on His words. For marriage, this means marriage built on Christ-centered values, prayer, and obedience will withstand storms. Your individual identity in Christ feeds directly into the health of your union because the marriage is the house built on the rock.

Without daily commitment to God's truth, marriages face erosion from worldly pressures, misunderstandings, and trials. But when both spouses are anchored in Christ—listening to and obeying Him—the relationship grows in strength, resilience, and joy.

How deeply is your marriage founded on the rock of Christ today? Evaluate whether Christ is the center of your priorities and decisions, both individually and as a couple. Building intentionally on His word leads to life-giving, unbreakable bonds.

Devotional: Growing Together as One in Christ

The Bible describes marriage as a profound union where two become one flesh (**Genesis 2:24**). This oneness is not merely physical but spiritual and emotional. True unity flows best when each individual's identity is rooted firmly in Christ, enabling both to come together as whole, secure, and committed partners.

Jesus' prayer in John 17 reminds us that unity reflects God's own nature and is a powerful testimony to the world. *But unity is a choice and a daily act of faith.* When couples invite Christ into their relationship, holding Him as the third strand in the relationship's cord (**Ecclesiastes 4:12**), their bond grows stronger than any worldly force.
