Day 1: ① Called to Serve with Wisdom

#### Devotional: Discern God's Timing and Serve Wisely

#### Devotional: Protect Your Heart to Maintain Balance

Healthy boundaries begin with guarding our hearts. Proverbs 4:23 exhorts us to protect our inner being because it is the source of life. Ministry can expose us to heavy burdens, but Jesus invites us in Matthew 11 to find rest in Him.

Setting limits is not selfishness; it is a biblical act that protects the heart from overload and resentment. Galatians 6:5 reminds every believer to carry their own load, highlighting personal responsibility to avoid codependency.

Jesus' teaching in Matthew 5:37 urges honesty and simplicity in our speech. Saying no respectfully and clearly honors God and protects us from overextension. 2 Timothy 1:7 reminds us that God fills us with power, love, and self-control—not fear—enabling us to set limits courageously.

**Reflect on your comfort level with saying no.** Are you hesitant because of fear or guilt? Today, pray for strength to set clear boundaries rooted in faith and love, knowing that saying no is a vital part of healthy ministry stewardship.

#### Devotional: Daily Renewal Through Abiding in Christ

Galatians 1 challenges us to consider whose approval we seek. When healthy boundaries clash with people's demands, we must prioritize God's approval. Matthew 6:33 calls us to seek God's kingdom first.

Reflect on whether you are fulfilling God's call or trying to meet everyone's expectations. Boundaries help keep the focus on God's purposes, enabling ministry that is sustainable and faithful.

Day 9: O Delegating to Empower Others

#### Devotional: Share the Load Through Wise Delegation

**Delegation is a biblical practice to prevent burnout.** In Exodus 18, Moses was advised to share leadership responsibilities to avoid exhaustion. Ministry does not require doing everything oneself.

2 Timothy 2 encourages entrusting ministry work to others to multiply God's work. Proverbs 11 emphasizes the safety in many counselors, reminding us that teamwork strengthens the body.

**Today, examine areas you may be holding too tightly in ministry.** Pray for discernment about who you can empower. Delegation honors God's design for community and sustains your own wellbeing.

Psalm 37 encourages patience and stillness before God. 1 Corinthians 10 assures us God will provide an escape from temptation or pressure, including overcommitment.

Reflect on how often you feel overwhelmed by too many tasks. Are you neglecting what is essential in ministry and life? Trust God to guide your priorities and provide strength to say no to excess demands.

Philippians promises God's peace will guard our hearts when we surrender anxiety. 1 Peter encourages casting our cares on God because He deeply cares for us.

# Devotional: Build Strength Through Godly Accountability

## Devotional: Lean Fully on God's Strength and Care

#### Devotional: Embrace Boundaries as Holy Discipline
