Jesus reaffirms this with claims of resurrection and abundant life for all who believe in Him. The book of Revelation paints a beautiful picture of the new heaven and earth, where death, sorrow, and pain are forever removed.

This hope encourages men to live unshaken by the fear of death, anticipating a glorious future with Christ, fully restored and eternally joyful.
