Day 1: ● Speaking Truth with Boldness

#### Your Verse

Ephesians 6:19–20 – "Pray also for me, that whenever I speak, words may be given me so that I will fearlessly make known the mystery of the gospel."

#### **Supporting Scriptures**

- Proverbs 28:1 The wicked flee though no one pursues, but the righteous are as bold as a lion.
- 2 Timothy 1:7 For the Spirit God gave us does not make us timid, but gives us power, love and self-discipline.







Day 1: ♣ Speaking Truth with Boldness

#### Devotional: Finding Courage to Speak God's Truth

Speaking truth boldly is often the first step toward living godly courage. The Apostle Paul models this for us in Ephesians 6 when he asks for prayer to speak fearlessly, demonstrating dependence on God's power rather than human strength alone. Truth isn't always easy or popular, but God calls men to be truth-tellers regardless of the cost.

Bold speech is rooted in confidence in God's Word and love for others. Proverbs reminds us that the righteous are as bold as lions—a striking image of strength and courage that comes from walking rightly before God. This courage is not aggression but a fearless commitment to stand firmly on what is true.

Reflecting on 2 Timothy, remember that God's Spirit doesn't produce timidity but power, love, and self-discipline. Boldness infused with love and self-control allows us to communicate truth while building others up rather than tearing them down.

Challenge yourself today to speak up in areas where you might have been silent. Ask God to empower your words, to use your voice as a vessel of His truth and love in a world hungry for both.

- Psalm 27:1 The Lord is my light and my salvation—whom shall I fear? The Lord is the stronghold of my life—of whom shall I be afraid?







#### Devotional: Rooted in God to Stand Unshaken

In a culture that shifts values and priorities almost daily, standing firm in your faith requires intentional courage and vigilance. Paul's words to the Corinthians are straightforward: be alert, stand steady, be brave, and strong. This is a call to spiritual resilience when everything around us seems unstable and passive.

God's promises are the foundation for this boldness. Joshua's charge reminds us repeatedly that God's presence accompanies courage; we don't face challenges alone. This transforms fear into faith-driven strength.

The psalmist's question, "Of whom shall I be afraid?" is a powerful reminder that God's light and salvation disarm fear. When you truly internalize this truth, it becomes possible to hold your ground without wavering, even when cultural pressures push you to blend in or back down.

Today, identify places where cultural pressures may be tempting you to compromise or remain silent. Stand firm in God's promises and ask Him to empower your resolve to reflect His strength in every situation.

#### Devotional: Trusting God While Taking Courageous Risks

God calls men not just to courage but to holy risk — stepping beyond comfort zones to pursue His purposes. The writer of Hebrews reminds us that with the Lord as our helper, fear loses its grip and risks become opportunities to trust Him more deeply.

*Queen Esther's story is a timeless example.* Faced with danger, she embraced risk because she understood the greater purpose God had assigned her. Her bravery saved a nation and changed history.

Similarly, the early church faced threats yet prayed boldly for courage to speak the gospel fearlessly. Your everyday decisions may not feel like life-or-death, but taking holy risks—whether for truth, justice, or mercy—is part of godly boldness.

Ask God to reveal moments where He is calling you to step out in faith. Remember, your risks are not reckless but rooted in reliance on God's power and guidance.

# Devotional: Courageous Leadership Rooted in Integrity

Godly men are called to lead courageously, not just by position but through character and example. Paul's qualifications in Timothy emphasize integrity, self-control, and faithfulness — qualities that inspire trust and respect.

Courageous leadership involves sacrifice and humility. Joshua's declaration about his household shows the importance of leading your family by committing to serve the Lord together. It's a daily, active choice requiring boldness amid cultural pressures towards complacency.

Micah's words remind leaders to marry justice, mercy, and humility in their walk. Courage without these virtues can slip into pride or rashness, but godly courage leads to wise and loving leadership.

Examine your own leadership roles. How can you strengthen your character and lead with both courage and humility? God empowers leaders who are willing to walk the hard path with integrity.

#### Devotional: Replacing Fear with Faith and Boldness

Fear often lurks as the enemy of boldness, but God's Word encourages us to move forward despite it. Isaiah 41 provides one of the most reassuring promises: God's presence dispels fear and dismay.

King Hezekiah rallied his people to trust God amid terrifying threats from Assyria. Their courageous response didn't mean the absence of fear — but a conscious reliance on God's power to protect and guide.

The psalmist captures this beautifully when he says, "When I am afraid, I put my trust in you." Boldness begins the moment we choose to replace fear with faith, even when feelings pull us the other direction.

Today, acknowledge any fears holding you back. Invite God's presence into those moments and lean on His promises to fuel courageous steps forward.

#### Devotional: Grace-Filled Boldness in Speaking

Boldness in speech is not only about what we say but how we say it. Paul encourages believers to mix grace with their truth, ensuring words uplift, influence, and build others.

James reminds us to be quick to listen and slow to anger, showing that godly boldness values wisdom and restraint over impulsiveness. This balance tempers courage with love, enabling effective communication that honors God.

Proverbs gives us practical wisdom — gentle answers diffuse conflict, while harsh words escalate damage. Bold men rely on the Holy Spirit to guide their speech so that their voices bring peace and truth simultaneously.

Today, reflect on your daily conversations. Ask God for wisdom and grace in your words to be bold yet loving, salt and light in your speech.

#### Devotional: Everyday Courage to Exalt Christ

Godly boldness is not a one-time act but a daily attitude of surrender and courage that exalts Christ above all. Paul's hopeful declaration in Philippians shows us that regardless of circumstances—life or death—our boldness honors Jesus.

Romans reinforces this by declaring the gospel as our power source, not our own might. Boldness springs from confidence in God's saving work and grace.

Paul also reminds us that God's grace suffices, especially in moments of weakness. Our boldness is perfect not because we are strong, but because God's power works through our vulnerabilities.

Today and every day, choose to live with courage that reflects Christ. Let Him be your strength, guide, and motivation to take holy risks, speak truth, and act with unwavering faith.
