Day 1: V Called to Be Salt and Light

#### Devotional: Living as Salt and Light Among Culture

Being salt and light means Christian men are called to influence society positively without losing their distinct identity. Salt preserves and flavors; light dispels darkness and guides the way. In the messy arena of culture and politics, it is easy to be either irrelevant or overly combative. Jesus' words remind us to maintain our spiritual vitality and impact.

#### Devotional: Walking Humbly with Justice and Mercy

**Justice and mercy** are at the heart of biblical civic engagement. Micah's timeless words challenge us to focus not merely on political outcomes but on the character with which we participate. A Christian man must walk humbly with God, grounded in justice and mercy, reflecting God's heart for people.

When engaging in culture or voting, it is easy to become focused on winning or defending ideologies. However, Scripture calls us to justice that protects the weak and mercy that restores the broken. This balance requires a humble spirit that recognizes our own need for grace before calling out the flaws in society.

You might feel torn between political parties or stuck frustrated by broken systems. Take heart! God entrusts you with influence not for personal gain but to be His agent of reconciliation and fairness. Let your faith move beyond talk; let it translate into loving action that honors God and serves your neighbor.

Today, seek God's heart for justice and mercy as you consider your role in civic life. Pray for wisdom to discern how best to act and speak with love, even when opinions differ.

# Devotional: Praying for Godly Wisdom and Discernment

#### Devotional: Casting Your Vote with Prayerful Intent

Voting is one of the most tangible ways Christian men engage culture and civic life. Paul reminds believers to respect governing authorities, recognizing that God ordains leaders and governments. This gives voting a spiritual dimension beyond mere political preference.

Pray especially for those in leadership; they impact communities deeply. Being a faithful citizen means participating thoughtfully, not passively. It means weighing candidates and issues with prayerful consideration, guided by God's Word and conscience.

Remember, you are called to choose what pleases God most, not simply what aligns with a party or social pressure. Your vote reflects stewardship of influence God has granted you. It is also an act of love toward your neighbors and your nation.
