The culture may promote dominance or aggression as strength, but Christ demonstrates strength through humility and obedience—even to the point of death.

Paul's call in Colossians and Ephesians restates the need to embody these virtues daily as clothing and posture.

Ask the Spirit to cultivate these fruits in your heart so they naturally overflow in preaching and pastoral care.
