#### Devotional: Trials Build Enduring Spiritual Character

Trials are not signs of God's absence but instruments of His refining work in our lives. James encourages believers to embrace difficulties with a joyful heart, knowing that the testing of faith cultivates perseverance and maturity.

For men preparing for the end times, character is essential—it is the foundation on which faith stands secure. Each trial shapes us, helps us grow stronger in dependence on God, and prepares us to lead effectively and authentically under pressure.

Perseverance born of trial creates character, and character leads to hope—a hope grounded not in circumstances but in the promises of God. When we face uncertainties, hardships, or opposition, we can find joy because God is forming us into men who mirror Christ's steadfast love and power.

For men leading others, this is a critical discipline. The world's messages often contradict God's truth, stirring doubt, fear, or compromise. We must intentionally filter what we consume through God's Word and pray for His peace to guard our inner being.

When anxiety or confusion arise, turning to Scripture and trusting God secures our hearts and minds. This guarded peace strengthens us to withstand spiritual attacks and be sound leaders. Evaluate today what you are guarding carefully. Are there influences or thoughts that need surrender or replacement with God's truth?
