Your Verse

Supporting Scriptures

- *Romans 8:28 – “And we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him.”*
- *Psalms 34:18 – “The Lord is close to the brokenhearted and saves those who are crushed in spirit.”*



Day 1:  Facing the Loss: Trusting God's Sovereignty

Devotional: Trusting God's Plan Amid Career Loss

When a career suddenly ends or shifts in painful ways, it can feel like your world is crumbling. The identity you built around your job may feel shattered, and uncertainty floods your mind.

Yet, *God's promises remain steadfast even in those moments.* Jeremiah 29:11 reminds us that the Lord knows the plans He has for us—plans filled with hope and purpose. This is not a promise that life will be easy, but that God's sovereign hand guides every season, including this difficult one.

Feeling crushed or brokenhearted is natural, but Psalm 34:18 assures us that God is especially near in those moments. He does not abandon us when we feel lost or discouraged.

Today is about bringing your pain honestly to God and choosing to trust His greater plan. Though you cannot see the full picture, you can rest in the truth that He is working all things together for your good, as Romans 8:28 promises.

3. In what ways have you tried to control your career situation instead of surrendering it to God?

Devotional: Embracing Your God-Given Identity

Our society often links a man's identity to his job title, salary, or level of success. When these shift or disappear, it can feel like the foundation beneath you is gone.

But Scripture calls us to a higher, more lasting identity. Genesis 1:27 profoundly declares that every person is created in God's image. Your value is not tied to human achievements but anchored in being a reflection of your Creator.

Moreover, 1 Samuel 16:7 reminds us that God looks beyond outward status or appearance. *He sees the heart.* Your worth is grounded in who you are as God's beloved child, not what you produce or earn.

Paul further teaches in Colossians 3:3 that your true life is hidden with Christ. When career roles fade, your eternal identity in Him remains secure and unshakeable.

Today, embrace your identity as God's masterpiece — unique, valued, and loved. Reject society's narrow measures of success and start seeing yourself through God's eyes.
