Introduction

Men have a vital role in confronting male sexual violence, a grievous sin that shatters lives and distorts God's design for dignity and love. This study is a call to action for Christian men to be catalysts of biblical justice, embodying both truth and mercy. Standing against abuse requires courage, compassion, and a deep commitment to God's Word.

Throughout Scripture, men are called to protect the vulnerable, uphold righteousness, and walk humbly with God (**Micah 6:8**). True biblical justice not only condemns sin but actively pursues healing and restoration for survivors through support and truth.

This 7-day journey equips men to understand the biblical view of justice and masculinity, to confront harmful behaviors boldly, and to minister healing to those affected. Each day blends Scripture, devotionals, reflection, journaling, and prayer—challenging us to reject passivity, to speak out, and to embody Christlike mercy.

With God's help, Christian men can rise as protectors, advocates, and healers. This militant love stands firm against abuse, restoring the dignity God bestowed on every person. Join this transformative path, and let your life be a testimony of justice and compassion in a broken world.

Devotional: Answering God's Call to Protect Others

Men are uniquely called by God to be defenders and protectors—not oppressors. Psalm 82:3 reminds us to rise up for the weak and vulnerable, those most often harmed by male sexual violence. This calling is not passive; it requires intentional action rooted in justice.

True masculinity in God's eyes honors and safeguards others. It speaks out against abuse even when it's uncomfortable or unpopular. Proverbs 31:8 commands us to raise our voices for those silenced by trauma and fear.

Justice is not just legal fairness—it's a heart posture and lifestyle. As Micah 6:8 says, to act justly means confronting evil, to love mercy means offering restoration, and to walk humbly means depending daily on God's strength for courage and wisdom.

Let us begin this journey by committing ourselves to be men who protect, serve, and bring healing rather than harm or silence.

Day 2: 6 Confronting Sin with Truth and Mercy

Your Verse

Ephesians 4:15 - 'Speaking the truth in love, we will grow to become in every respect the mature body of him who is the head, that is, Christ.'

Supporting Scriptures

- James 5:20 'Whoever turns a sinner from the error of their way will save them from death.'
- Galatians 6:1 'Restore gently, but watch yourself, or you also may be tempted.'







Day 2: (Confronting Sin with Truth and Mercy

Devotional: Balancing Truth and Love in Confrontation

One of the hardest but most necessary tasks men must undertake is to confront sin within our communities, especially sexual violence perpetuated by men. Ephesians 4:15 teaches the balance: speak truth inspired by love.

Truth without love can become harsh condemnation; love without truth can lead to silence and enabling. Christian men must pursue both—confronting error to bring repentance and restoration, as James 5:20 encourages, while caring for others gently, knowing our own weaknesses.

Restoration is a process requiring patience and humility. It demands boldness to name evil, yet deep mercy to facilitate healing. We cannot be silent because the cost of silence is the continued harm to survivors and families.

Today, reflect on how to courageously and lovingly confront sin and empower transformation in your circle of influence.

Your Verse

Colossians 3:19 - 'Husbands, love your wives and do not be harsh with them.'

Supporting Scriptures

- 1 Peter 3:7 'Husbands, in the same way be considerate as you live with your wives.'
- Romans 12:10 'Be devoted to one another in love. Honor one another above yourselves.'







Devotional: Living a Life of Respect and Love

The sin of male sexual violence violates God's design for respect, love, and honor in relationships. Colossians 3:19 calls husbands to love without harshness—a standard of kindness that should extend to all men's interactions with women.

Peter reinforces this, urging men to be considerate, understanding, and gentle in their treatment of women in their lives. This is a direct opposition to any form of abuse or control.

Romans 12:10 underscores honor as a daily practice among believers. Christian men must cultivate respect that honors women's dignity and autonomy. Rejecting abuse means actively building cultures of respect, affirming survivors, and educating peers to do the same.

Today, commit to rejecting any attitudes or behaviors that demean, control, or harm. Embrace respect as your non-negotiable standard.

List attitudes or beliefs you need to confront and change about gender and power.

Day 4: **B** Supporting Survivors with Compassion

Your Verse

2 Corinthians 1:3-4 - 'The God of all comfort who comforts us in all our troubles, so that we can comfort those in any trouble with the comfort we ourselves receive.'

Supporting Scriptures

- Romans 12:15 'Rejoice with those who rejoice; mourn with those who mourn.'
- Isaiah 61:1 'He has sent me to bind up the brokenhearted.'







Day 4: Supporting Survivors with Compassion

Devotional: Being a Source of Healing and Comfort

Survivors of male sexual violence often face overwhelming pain and isolation. As Christian men called to follow Christ's heart, we must be sources of comfort and healing.

Paul reminds us in 2 Corinthians that God comforts us so we can extend that comfort to others. This means listening actively, believing survivors, and standing in solidarity rather than doubt or judgment.

Romans 12:15 calls us to share in both joy and sorrow, reflecting a genuine empathy that honors the survivor's experience. Jesus' mission, described in Isaiah 61, includes binding up the brokenhearted—meaning we participate in God's healing work by showing compassion.

Supporting survivors requires humility, patience, and sometimes setting aside our discomfort to prioritize their needs and dignity.

Isaiah 1:17 - 'Learn to do right; seek justice. Defend the oppressed.'

Supporting Scriptures

- Proverbs 31:9 'Speak up and judge fairly; defend the rights of the poor and needy.'
- Luke 4:18 'He has sent me to proclaim freedom for the prisoners and recovery of sight for the blind.'







Devotional: Boldly Advocating for the Oppressed

Justice is not passive—it demands intentional pursuit and courage. Isaiah 1:17 commands us to learn righteousness and defend those oppressed by violence and injustice.

Men who stand for biblical justice against sexual violence must be advocates and allies who promote systemic change as well as individual support. Proverbs 31:9 calls for speaking up for the rights of the vulnerable with fairness.

Jesus' mission in Luke 4:18 illustrates ultimate justice—freedom from captivity and restoration of life. Pursuing justice may require us to confront difficult systems, raise awareness, and partner with survivors courageously.

Pray for boldness to take tangible steps toward justice in your church, workplace, and community.

Supporting Scriptures

- Galatians 6:2 'Carry each other's burdens.'
- Ephesians 4:29 'Do not let any unwholesome talk come out of your mouths.'







Day 6: OBuilding Safe Communities

Devotional: Fostering Safe and Supportive Environments

Communities of faith must be safe havens where survivors are protected and supported. Hebrews 10:24–25 encourages believers to motivate one another toward love and good deeds, including creating environments hostile to abuse.

Men have a crucial role in fostering safety by holding peers accountable, promoting respect, and listening carefully. Galatians 6:2 invites us to share burdens—this means survivors should not walk alone.

We must avoid harmful or dismissive speech as Ephesians 4:29 commands, cultivating instead conversations that build up and encourage justice and healing.

Ask God to help you contribute to such a community and identify practical ways to nurture safety and trust.

Devotional: Walking Humbly in Justice and Mercy

As this study closes, remember that living out God's justice requires an ongoing, humble commitment. Micah 6:8 summarizes the calling: act justly, love mercy, and walk humbly.

Yearning for righteousness, as Jesus highlights in Matthew 5:6, fuels our endurance and passion to confront wrong. God gives us power, love, and self-discipline through His Spirit to boldly do this important work without fear (2 Timothy 1:7).

Christian men must daily renew this calling, committing to be agents of healing, advocates for survivors, and reflectors of Christ's character. May you walk forward with courage, wisdom, and compassion—living justice and mercy in every step.
