Devotional: God's Ever-Present Strength in Weakness

Psalm 46:1 assures believers that God provides strength and help when we feel weak or fearful. For men facing the unknown in end-of-life seasons, this means you are never alone. Psalm 73:26 confesses human frailty but declares God as the unfailing strength of the heart. No matter how weak the body, God's sustaining power remains.

Joy from the Lord is not superficial happiness but deep spiritual strength, as explained in **Nehemiah 8:10**. This joy empowers endurance in hard seasons.

Today, place your hope in God afresh and invite Him to renew your physical, emotional, and spiritual strength.

Psalm 34:18 promises God's nearness especially when our hearts are broken or spirits crushed, and **Matthew 5:4** blesses those who mourn, offering assurance of God's comfort.

Today, open your heart to receive God's compassion and allow His comfort to heal the ache within you.
