Devotional: The Divine Mandate to Invest

Devotional: Lead by Example in Character

Your integrity, love, humility, and purity will either inspire or discourage those you lead. Be mindful that young leaders often watch more than listen, absorbing your attitudes as much as your teachings.

Remember *James' sobering warning* that teachers and mentors carry a heavier responsibility. Strive to walk humbly, putting others' needs ahead of your own pride or ambition.

Ask God to reveal any areas where your character needs refinement. Be honest with yourself and willing to invite accountability. The greatest gift you can give a young leader is a mentor who lives out the Word with authenticity and grace.

Devotional: Using Words to Build Up

Think about how carefully Jesus spoke—always full of grace and truth, lovingly correcting but never condemning. We are called to imitate His example in our daily communication.

Consider the impact of your words on the hearts and minds of those you mentor. Are your words encouraging and timely? Do they reflect God's wisdom and love? Or do careless or harsh words create discouragement or confusion?

Pray that God will use your speech to plant seeds of faith, courage, and purpose. Commit to speaking life, knowing your words leave a lasting imprint on the leaders you're raising.
