Introduction

Welcome to this 7-day study on Mephibosheth at the King's Table. This remarkable story, found in *2 Samuel 9*, is a powerful testament to God's grace, kindness, and restoration. Often overlooked, Mephibosheth's story reminds us how God's covenant love reaches the most unexpected and broken places.

Mephibosheth, the son of Jonathan and grandson of Saul, was crippled and vulnerable, likely living in fear and obscurity after his family's fall. When King David, a man after God's own heart, inquires and seeks out Mephibosheth, he offers much more than mere kindness. David restores his inheritance, invites him to dine regularly at the king's table, and ensures his security.

Through these actions, we see a beautiful picture of the gospel: restoration despite brokenness, blessing despite past mistakes, and acceptance despite unworthiness. It challenges us to reflect on God's grace extended to us and challenges us to extend grace to others.

As you journey through this plan, consider how God wants to restore your heart and how you can become a vessel of His kindness to those around you. Let's open our hearts to embrace the story of Mephibosheth and the deep lessons it holds about grace, mercy, and divine restoration.















Your Verse

2 Samuel 9:1 - "Then David asked, 'Is there anyone still left of the house of Saul to whom I can show kindness for Jonathan's sake?'"

Supporting Scriptures

- Psalm 34:18 'The LORD is close to the brokenhearted and saves those who are crushed in spirit.'
- Luke 15:4 'Suppose one of you has a hundred sheep and loses one of them. Doesn't he leave the ninety-nine in the open country and go after the lost sheep until he finds it?'







Devotional: God Seeks the Broken and Forgotten

David's search for the remnant of Saul's house demonstrates a heart of compassion and remembrance. Despite Saul's complicated history with David, David honors his covenant with Jonathan by seeking kindness for his family. This pursuit shows God's initiative in seeking the lost and abandoned.

Mephibosheth was disabled and vulnerable, likely hidden away because of fear and shame. Yet David's deliberate inquiry illustrates a divine principle: no one is beyond God's reach. God actively seeks those who feel forgotten, broken, or unworthy.

Consider how God sees you today — not in your brokenness, but as someone worthy of His pursuit and grace. Are there areas in your life where you feel lost or hidden? God is actively seeking you, much like David sought Mephibosheth, to bring restoration and kindness into your story.







Reflect and Apply

1.	Have you ever felt overlooked or forgotten like Mephibosheth? How does knowing God actively seeks you change your perspective?
2.	What does David's example teach you about honoring your past relationships, even difficult ones?
3.	In what ways can you be more intentional in seeking and showing kindness to those who feel lost or excluded?







Journaling Prompts

1.	Write about a time you felt forgotten or overlooked. How did God reveal His presence in that season?
2.	List people in your life who may need your kindness and intentionality similar to David's toward Mephibosheth.
3.	Reflect on God's character as a seeker of the lost. How can this influence your daily walk?







Prayer for Today

Lord, thank You for seeking me when I was lost and forgotten. Help me to receive Your kindness and to trust in Your restoration. Teach me to be a seeker of those who feel broken and to extend the grace You freely give. May my heart align with Yours, showing mercy and kindness like David did for Mephibosheth. In Jesus' name, Amen.

Devotional: God's Faithfulness Through Covenant Love

David's motivation for kindness is rooted in the covenant he made with Jonathan. This personal commitment reveals that God's promises are enduring and faithful, not dependent on circumstances or merit.

The covenant reminds us of the unchanging nature of God's love and faithfulness. Even when we fall or face hardship, He remembers His promises and extends grace toward us.

Reflect on your own life and God's faithfulness. What promises has He made that give you hope today? Like David's remembrance of Jonathan, God recalls His covenant with us, inviting us to live in the reality of His grace, not our failures.

Devotional: Embracing Our Inheritance in Christ

David restores to Mephibosheth all the land that belonged to Saul's family, reinstating his rightful place. This bold act speaks a powerful message about identity and restoration. Despite Mephibosheth's disability and family downfall, he is given a dignified inheritance and honor.

For believers, this is a heart-transforming truth: **our identity and inheritance are secure in Christ.** Even when broken or battered by life's hardships, God restores us into His family with purpose and honor.

Take time today to reflect on your identity in Christ, and how God's restoration is working in your life. What parts of your story need healing or reclaiming? God invites you to live fully in the inheritance He provides.

Devotional: Seated with the King: Belonging and Honor

Being invited to eat at the king's table was a symbol of full acceptance, honor, and belonging. Mephibosheth was no longer a disabled outcast but a welcomed son at David's table. This echoes the gospel invitation where believers are seated with Christ in heavenly places.

Do you feel seated at God's table? Acceptance into God's family comes with dignity and a seat of honor. Often we may feel unworthy or distant, yet through Jesus, we are invited into intimate fellowship with the King.

Today, embrace the reality of your place at God's table, a reminder that His grace breaks all barriers of shame and unworthiness. Live in the confidence of His acceptance and share that grace with others who might feel excluded.

Allow yourself to rest in God's care today. Consider the ways He has provided for you and trust that He will continue to protect and supply your deepest needs. Remember, you are never alone at the King's table.
