### Devotional: Faith Unblocks the Way for Healing

The story of the paralytic lowered through the roof challenges us to consider the power of faith and Jesus' authority to forgive sins. The friends of the paralytic displayed incredible determination and faith by creating a way for him to meet Jesus. Their bold faith opened the door for healing — both physical and spiritual. ### Devotional: Faith Calms Life's Fiercest Storms

In the midst of a fierce storm, Jesus demonstrated His authority over nature, calming not only the sea but also the hearts of His disciples. The disciples' fear reflected their limited understanding, while Jesus challenged their doubt by asking, 'Where is your faith?' This moment invites us into a profound lesson about trusting God amid life's storms.

Life's challenges can sometimes feel overwhelming—like raging seas—but Jesus is sovereign over every storm. Sometimes faith is not about the absence of fear, but responding to fear with trust in Jesus' presence and power. # Devotional: Faith in Touch Brings Healing

The woman with a long-term bleeding condition approached Jesus in faith, believing that even touching His cloak would bring healing. Despite years of suffering and social isolation, her quiet determination highlights the profound impact of personal faith.

Jesus not only healed her physically but also publicly affirmed her faith, restoring her dignity and place in community. Often, we carry invisible burdens or chronic pain that others do not see. This story encourages us to approach Jesus boldly, trusting in His power to heal even what seems beyond repair.

Her courage to reach out shows us that faith sometimes requires stepping out quietly but intentionally. Jesus' response tells us that He notices our faith and honors it with healing and peace. Consider how you might bring your hopes and unspoken needs to Jesus, trusting Him to respond.

This event invites us to trust God's ability to provide beyond what we can imagine. It also highlights the importance of offering what we have, no matter how small, to Jesus. When we surrender our resources in faith, God can use them powerfully to bless many.

Consider how you might bring your 'five loaves and two fish'—your gifts, talents, or time—to Jesus today and trust Him to multiply your efforts for His glory. Feeding the crowd also signals Jesus' care for whole-person needs, encouraging us to seek Him for daily sustenance and spiritual satisfaction.

Day 5: Maising Jairus' Daughter

### Devotional: Jesus Calls Us to New Life

When Jairus, a synagogue leader, approached Jesus begging Him to heal his dying daughter, he showed vulnerable faith despite societal expectations. The tragic news that the girl had died could have ended hope, but Jesus defied death itself by raising her to life.

This miracle reminds us that no situation is beyond Jesus' power, and often faith calls us to hold on courageously amidst despair. Jesus' invitation to "get up" echoes today as a call to rise from spiritual and emotional death, fear, or hopelessness.

Consider the spheres in your life where Jesus is calling you to new life—whether healing relationships, renewing joy, or restoring hope. This story also illustrates Jesus' personal care and attention, even amid interruptions and crowd demands.

### Devotional: Jesus Opens What Is Closed Within Us

The healing of the man who was deaf and had a speech impediment showcases Jesus' compassion toward those isolated by physical limitations. By touching and commanding "Ephphatha" ('Be opened!'), Jesus not only restored hearing and speech but also opened a pathway to human connection and worship.

This miracle invites us to see Jesus as the One who opens the closed parts of our lives, whether in communication, relationships, or spiritual barriers. Often, silence or isolation can cloud our understanding of God's voice and limit our witness.

Jesus' healing power invites us to ask Him to open what is closed in us—ears to hear His Word, mouths to proclaim His goodness, and hearts to connect with others.
