Let's embark on this study with open hearts, ready to recognize God's hand in every detail, and to celebrate how He exalted Mordecai, a model of humble







faithfulness.

## Devotional: God Honors Quiet Faithfulness

Mordecai's faithful presence at the king's gate was no accident. Though the situation seemed risky, Mordecai uncovered a deadly plot against King Xerxes, demonstrating vigilance and integrity.

Often, God places us in situations where His providence is at work, even if we cannot see it clearly. Mordecai's quiet faithfulness positioned him perfectly to protect the king and preserve the kingdom's future.
