Moses and the Burning Bush: A Journey of Call and Courage



Explore Moses' encounter with God at the burning bush, his doubts, God's patience, and the rise of a reluctant leader over 21 days.





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Introduction

The story of Moses and the burning bush is one of the most profound and inspiring moments in the Bible. It marks the beginning of a journey where an ordinary man encounters the extraordinary presence of God and is called to an extraordinary mission. For three weeks, this study plan will guide you through Moses' call, his doubts and excuses, and God's perfect patience and power in shaping a leader who would liberate an entire nation.

In the book of Exodus, we find Moses tending sheep when he is drawn to a bush that burns with fire yet is not consumed. God's voice calls out to him from the flames, commanding him to return to Egypt and lead the Israelites out of slavery. What follows is a powerful exchange filled with hesitation — Moses gives excuse after excuse, fearing inadequacy and rejection. Yet, God meets him with patience, reassurance, and a clear purpose.

This study will help you dive deep into these rich Scriptures, reflecting on God's faithfulness to call imperfect people for His perfect plans. You'll consider how God's patience can transform doubts into trust, fears into boldness, and reluctance into action. Throughout the 21 days, you will engage with God's Word through readings, devotional reflections, and reflective questions to help you relate Moses' journey to your own walk of faith.

This journey reminds us that God's call comes often in unexpected ways and invites us into a purpose greater than ourselves. Like Moses, we may feel inadequate or unprepared, but God's strength is made perfect in our







weakness. May this study inspire you to listen for God's voice, respond with faith, and trust Him to lead you in your own calling and mission.

Devotional: God's Mysterious Presence Reveals Himself

The image of the burning bush is powerful and unusual. Fire usually consumes and destroys, yet here, the bush is aflame but remains unburned. This moment is theophany — God's miraculous presence revealing Himself to Moses in a mysterious and holy way.

God initiating communication through this burning bush invites Moses, a simple shepherd at that time, into an encounter with the divine. It reminds us that God can show up in unexpected places and ways, often when we are paying attention in the midst of ordinary life.

When Moses responds to the sight by turning aside, God calls him by name — a personal and tender moment revealing God's intimate knowledge and care. It encourages us to listen carefully for God's voice in our own lives, even in quiet or mysterious places.

As you begin this study, consider how God might be appearing in your life. Are there 'burning bushes' where God is calling your name today?

Day 2: Q Moses' Reluctant Response

Devotional: When Feeling Unqualified, God Provides Strength

Moses' first response to God's call is one of doubt and insecurity. He questions his own worth and ability, feeling unqualified to confront Pharaoh and lead a nation. This mirrors a common struggle many of us face when called to step beyond our comfort zones.

God's calling often meets our self-doubt head-on. Yet, throughout Scripture, God chooses imperfect people for His perfect work. Gideon also questioned his ability, and Paul learned that God's strength shines brightest in human weakness.

God is not looking for flawless leaders but willing hearts. Moses' hesitation reveals his humility, but God's assurance reveals His power to equip and empower those He chooses.

Today, reflect on your own insecurities in responding to God's call. Remember: feeling unqualified does not disqualify you from God's purpose.

Devotional: God's Loving Patience Eases Our Fears

Moses continues to express doubt, asking God what if others won't believe him. This shows Moses' fear of rejection and failure, concerns many of us understand deeply.

Yet, God patiently listens and provides signs and reassurance. Moses' humility shines through — he is not a bold or prideful man but one hesitant and fearful. God's response exemplifies divine patience with human reluctance.

God does not force our obedience or rush us but lovingly meets us where we are and walks with us through our fears. His patience is an invitation to grow in faith and trust.

Reflect on God's patience in your own life. How is He encouraging you gently, even when you hesitate?

Devotional: God Provides Power and Assurance

To reassure Moses and give him confidence, God provides miraculous signs. From his staff turning into a snake to his hand becoming leprous and healed, these signs serve as evidence of God's power working through Moses.

God equips those He calls, not only with promises but with tangible demonstrations of His sovereignty. These wonders serve to bolster Moses' faith and lend authority to his mission.

When you face daunting tasks, remember God stands with you and will provide what you need — wisdom, power, or reassurance — to fulfill His purpose.

God's supernatural signs are a reminder that His power goes beyond human limitations and fears.

God recognizes that Moses will need support. When Moses expresses concern about his speaking abilities, God sends Aaron, his brother, as a spokesperson and helper.

This reminds us that though God calls us individually, He often provides partners, communities, and resources to help us accomplish His work. No one is meant to walk the journey of faith completely alone.

God's provision of Aaron encourages reliance on teamwork and trusting in God to bring the people we need to walk alongside us.

Consider the people God has placed in your life as helpers and companions on your spiritual journey.



Day 6: XX Leaving the Familiar Behind

Devotional: Courage to Leave the Comfortable Behind

God's call asks Moses to leave his comfortable life in Midian. He must approach Pharaoh, confront injustice, and lead a nation into freedom. This requires courage, obedience, and a willingness to step into the unknown.

Often God's call requires leaving behind familiarity, security, or our comfort zones. Moses' story encourages us to trust God rather than cling to the past.

Following God means sometimes traveling through uncertainty, carrying the risks and challenges that obedience entails. Yet, God promises His presence — 'I will be with you' — assuring us we are never alone.

Devotional: God Equips Us for His Mission

Moses voices his insecurity about his speaking ability. God does not condemn him but provides Aaron to speak on his behalf and assures him that He will guide his words.

Many people feel unprepared or unworthy to share their faith or fulfill God's calling due to fears around communication or knowledge. God's response to Moses shows His understanding nature and willingness to empower us through His Spirit and help from others.

The Holy Spirit helps us overcome our weaknesses and equips us for the task. Fear of inadequacy should not stop us from responding to God's call.

Obedience to God's call flows out of worship and trust. The people's acceptance contrasts with Moses' earlier doubts, showing how faith grows in community alongside divine revelation.

Facing opposition is often part of obedience to God. Moses models courage grounded not in self-reliance but in confidence in God's sovereignty.

However, trials refine character and faith. God uses hardships to teach perseverance and hope, preparing His people and their leaders.

Remember that discouragement is part of the journey, but God's purpose remains steadfast. Keep trusting and pressing forward.
