Signs often accompany obedience to encourage faith in moments of uncertainty. Moses had to trust God's promise that these miracles would authenticate his mission, despite the challenges ahead.

In our lives, God may provide confirmations or signs to assure us He is working. Yet, we should not seek signs merely to alleviate doubt; rather, signs point us back to trusting God's Word and character.

Reflect on God's faithfulness in providing what you need to step out in obedience. His power backs those He calls, using even small, miraculous confirmations to build boldness in faith.

This plague emphasizes that God's discipline, though patient, is purposeful and powerful. It is God's way of drawing attention to sin and prompting repentance—both for Pharaoh and for us today.

When we ignore God's voice, hardship can increase, but God's intentions remain redemptive. Moses' obedience brings God's discipline as a sign to Egypt to release His people, demonstrating God's justice and mercy.

Reflect on areas where God might be calling you to repentance or obedience before His discipline intensifies. God desires restoration and freedom.

The hardening of Pharaoh's heart reminds us of the mystery of divine sovereignty and human responsibility. God allowed Pharaoh's stubbornness to continue, displaying His glory through judgement yet holding Pharaoh accountable for rebellion.

This tension teaches humility as we wrestle with God's purposes beyond full human understanding. It also warns against persistent rebellion which can toughen a heart against God's grace.

Moses' mission depended on faith-filled obedience, not the response of others. Our call remains to obey God faithfully regardless of outward circumstances.

Today, pray for humility and sensitivity to avoid resisting God's voice, and for boldness to continue obedience even amid unyielding opposition.
