Instead, it approaches issues with gentleness and a heart ready to forgive.

This posture invites healing and softens hardened hearts, creating space for positive change.

Reflect today on ways you can actively choose kindness, even when it feels difficult. Pray for your spouse, asking God to work in their heart, and seek His strength to embody the virtues that build up your relationship.
