Day 1: K Facing the Broken Walls

# Devotional: Recognizing the Call to Rebuild Broken Walls

#### Devotional: The Power of Prayer Before Action

# Devotional: Responding to Spiritual Opposition with Faith

Faithful endeavors often face resistance, whether through external discouragement, internal doubt, or unexpected obstacles. Nehemiah's response was not to give in but to pray and prepare for defense, showing the balance between spiritual reliance and practical action.

When challenges arise in your path, reflect on how you respond. Do you become discouraged or do you stand firm in faith? Remember, opposition is often a sign that you are moving in God's direction and that He will equip you to persevere.
