A 7-day study to bring veterans courage, hope, and peace through Scripture, overcoming suicidal thoughts with God's steadfast love.





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Introduction

Welcome to this journey of hope and healing. As veterans, you've faced battles few understand—some external, others internal. The weight of memories, pain, and despair can sometimes lead to dark places, including thoughts of suicide. Yet, God's Word shines a light into the deepest darkness, inviting you to find strength, purpose, and life beyond struggle. *This study is designed with your heart and strength in mind.*

Each day offers a Scripture passage, encouragement, and reflections to root you in God's unwavering love. Veterans are resilient, not just because of their training or experiences, but because God's promises sustain them—offering victory not only in war but in the war for your soul. **You are not alone**. Through Scripture, prayer, and reflection, we will explore how God's presence can overcome despair and how His hope can restore joy and peace.

Whether you are battling heavy thoughts or walking alongside a veteran who is, this plan provides spiritual nourishment tailored to the unique struggles and strengths of those who have served. Remember, your life has divine value that no circumstance can diminish.

May this time draw you nearer to God, the source of hope that never fades. Together, let's embrace God's light, step by step, day by day.









Day 1: V Strength in the Lord









Your Verse

Psalm 18:1-2 - "I love you, Lord, my strength. The Lord is my rock, my fortress and my deliverer; my God is my rock, in whom I take refuge, my shield and the horn of my salvation, my stronghold."

Supporting Scriptures

- Isaiah 41:10 "So do not fear, for I am with you; do not be dismayed, for I am your God."
- 2 Corinthians 12:9 "My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness."







Devotional: Finding True Strength Through God's Refuge

As veterans, strength is part of your story. You have faced challenges that tested your limits physically and emotionally. But today, God reminds you that your true strength comes from Him. The Psalmist declares the Lord as "my rock," "fortress," and "deliverer." This imagery paints a picture of God as a shield around you in your bleakest moments.

Feeling overwhelmed or hopeless is understandable, but God invites you to find refuge in Him. His strength is perfect especially when we are weak—when suicidal thoughts creep in, when despair threatens to overtake you. There is power beyond human ability available to you.

Take a moment to recognize that trusting God requires courage—a courage you possess and have demonstrated. Remember, He never leaves or forsakes you, even when darkness feels overwhelming. Lean into His strength today and let it be the foundation to stand against despair.

1.	What does it mean to you that God is your stronghold and shield?
2.	How have you experienced God's strength in moments of weakness?
3.	What fears can you give over to God today knowing He is with you?







Journaling Prompts

	Write about a time when you felt God's protection like a fortress around you.
2.	List areas where you need God's strength in your current struggles.
3.	Describe what it feels like to surrender your fear to God.







Prayer for Today

Father God, today I thank You for being my rock and refuge. When I feel weak and overwhelmed, help me to remember that Your strength is made perfect in my weakness. Guard my heart and mind from despair. Surround me with Your peace and courage as I face each new day. Help me to lean into You, trusting that You are my shield and deliverer. *Replace my darkness with Your light.* In Jesus' name, Amen.









Day 2: A New Dawn of Hope









Your Verse

Lamentations 3:22-23 - "Because of the Lord's great love we are not consumed, for his compassions never fail. They are new every morning; great is your faithfulness."

Supporting Scriptures

- Romans 12:12 "Be joyful in hope, patient in affliction, faithful in prayer."
- Psalm 34:18 "The Lord is close to the brokenhearted and saves those who are crushed in spirit."







Devotional: Embracing God's Fresh Mercy and Hope

Hope is more than wishful thinking; it is a promise rooted in God's faithfulness. Even in the darkest night, a new morning dawns with God's unfailing compassion. For veterans wrestling with suicidal thoughts, the weight of past trauma or present pain can feel overwhelming, but God's mercies never run out.

Each day offers a fresh chance to embrace God's love and healing. Notice how the verse in Lamentations assures us that God's love sustains us so we are 'not consumed.' You might feel battered and broken, but God's compassion renews your soul daily.

Being patient in affliction doesn't mean passivity; it means holding on to hope and prayer even when the road is hard. God is especially near those who feel crushed; He sees your pain and walks beside you. Remember this new dawn of hope—you are not consumed. Instead, you are covered by God's steadfast love.







Reflect and Apply

1.	How have you felt God's compassion renewing your spirit lately?
2.	What does it mean to you that God's mercies are 'new every morning'?
3.	In what ways can you practice hope and patience during difficult times?







Journaling Prompts

1.	Write about a 'new morning' moment where hope broke through your darkness.
2.	List ways God has shown faithfulness in your life despite hardships.
3.	Reflect on how you can lean more on prayer when feeling crushed.







Prayer for Today

Lord, thank You for Your endless compassion and fresh mercies every day. When despair feels overwhelming, remind me that Your love does not fail. Help me to hold on to hope, to be patient in my struggles, and to pray continually. Draw close to my broken heart and heal my crushed spirit with Your unfailing faithfulness. Your Verse

Supporting Scriptures

- John 14:27 "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives."
- Isaiah 26:3 "You will keep in perfect peace those whose minds are steadfast, because they trust in you."







Day 3: 💙 Peace Beyond Understanding

Devotional: Receiving God's Surpassing Peace Today

Anxiety and despair often fuel suicidal thoughts, but God's peace offers a powerful alternative. Paul encourages us not to be anxious but to bring every concern to God with prayer and thanksgiving. This act of surrender invites God's peace—one that surpasses human logic and circumstance—to guard your heart and mind.

For veterans, the war within can create relentless turmoil. Yet, God offers a deep peace, distinct from what the world provides. It is steady, protective, and transformative.

Peace is a gift but also a process as you practice trusting Jesus. When overwhelming thoughts arise, turn to God with openness. Tell Him your fears and thank Him for what He's already doing. This spiritual habit can calm your heart and renew your mind, strengthening your resilience and anchoring you in God's presence through storms.

Supporting Scriptures

- 1 John 4:4 "He who is in you is greater than he who is in the world."







Devotional: Victorious Over Darkness Through God's Love

You are not defined by your struggles but by God's victorious power within you. Romans reminds believers they are 'more than conquerors' through Christ's love. This victory applies to spiritual battles, mental anguish, and the temptation to give in to despair.

Many veterans know what it means to face overwhelming odds, but God's strength offers an unbreakable advantage. Death, hardship, or mental torment cannot separate you from His love. You carry a power inside greater than any enemy.

Remember God's encouragement to Joshua—be strong and courageous because God is with you. You are not alone in your fight. When suicidal thoughts arise, affirm that the Spirit within you is greater than the darkness surrounding you. Draw on this truth now and every day to claim victory over discouragement and to walk in freedom and hope.

3.	In what ways can you rely more on God's strength today?







Journaling Prompts

1.	Write about a time you experienced God's power overcoming your fears.
2.	List fears or lies you want to claim victory over through Christ.
3.	Reflect on what courage looks like in your current circumstances.







Prayer for Today

Lord Jesus, thank You for making me more than a conqueror through Your love. When I feel weak or afraid, remind me that Your power within me is greater than any darkness or temptation. Help me to be strong and courageous today, knowing You will never leave me. Let Your love be my shield and victory. Amen.









Day 5: Bestoring the Weary









Your Verse

Matthew 11:28–30 – "Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest... For my yoke is easy and my burden is light."

Supporting Scriptures

- Psalm 23:1-3 "He restores my soul... He leads me beside quiet waters, he refreshes my soul."
- Isaiah 40:29–31 "He gives strength to the weary and increases the power of the weak."







Devotional: Accepting Jesus' Rest for Your Soul

The journey for many veterans is exhausting, both physically and emotionally. Jesus extends a heartfelt invitation to those who are weary and burdened: come to Him for true rest. This rest isn't just physical relief; it's soul restoration.

Life's pressures, post-traumatic experiences, and mental burdens can feel heavy. But Jesus says His yoke is easy and His burden light—offering help to carry what you cannot bear alone.

Through your relationship with Jesus, your soul can be refreshed, your strength renewed. God's restoration is gentle, patient, and deep, healing wounds that often remain invisible. Lean into this invitation today. Accept His peace and restoration, surrendering heavy loads and trusting His care.

1.	What burdens are you carrying that you need to give to Jesus?
2	How can you experience God's restoration in your daily life?
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3.	What does it mean to take Jesus' yoke and find rest?







Journaling Prompts

1.	Write about what 'rest' feels like for you spiritually and physically.
2.	List burdens you can surrender to Jesus right now.
3.	Reflect on moments when God refreshed your soul recently.







Prayer for Today

Dear Jesus, I come to You weary and heavy laden. Thank You for inviting me into Your rest. I surrender my burdens to You and ask for Your gentle restoration of my soul. Refresh me, renew my strength, and lighten my load as I trust in Your caring presence. Help me to walk with You daily, finding peace and hope in Your yoke. Amen.

Your Verse

Day 6: Q Light in the Darkness

Devotional: Walking in God's Unquenchable Light

Darkness may feel overwhelming at times, but it cannot extinguish God's light. The opening of John's Gospel declares a powerful truth: light shines into the darkest places and is never overcome by darkness.

Veterans battling inner darkness can find profound hope in this promise. God's light—the truth and life found in Jesus—penetrates despair, shame, and fear. The Lord is your light and salvation, so you have no reason to fear the shadows of your past or present.

Moreover, the Spirit God gives empowers you with love, power, and self-discipline. This means you carry His light within you to push back against despair. Embrace the courage born from the Spirit, and let God's light expose and dismantle the lies that fuel suicidal thoughts.

Today, embrace His plan with confidence and courage. Your story is not finished—God holds both your past and your future in His hands.
