Devotional: Start with Purpose to Overcome Laziness

Beginning your journey against sloth starts with understanding your divine purpose. Sloth often stems from a loss of motivation or unclear goals. The Apostle Paul encourages us to do everything "with all your heart," reminding us that our daily acts are ultimately service to God Himself.

Paul's strong words in Thessalonians confront any complacency: action is expected. Jesus' parable of the talents highlights that laziness is not only unproductive but displeasing to God.

Today, evaluate your spiritual disciplines. Are you consistently engaging in prayer, reading Scripture, and serving others? Recognize that spiritual growth requires intentional effort and that God expects fruitful labor from His children.
