Matthew 25:1-13 - "Then the kingdom of heaven will be like ten virgins who took their lamps..."

Supporting Scriptures

- Luke 12:35–36 "Be dressed ready for service and keep your lamps burning..."
- Revelation 16:15 "Look, I come like a thief! Blessed is the one who stays awake..."







Day 1: 1. The Parable of the Ten Virgins

Devotional: Stay Alert and Keep Your Lamps Burning

Jesus' parable of the ten virgins paints a vivid picture of readiness. Five wise virgins prepared adequately by bringing extra oil for their lamps, while five foolish virgins did not plan ahead. When the bridegroom came unexpectedly, only those ready entered the wedding feast.

What does this mean for us? Spiritually, our 'oil' represents faith, obedience, and a relationship with Jesus that sustains us when His return happens suddenly. Waiting does not mean idleness but active preparation through holiness and watchfulness. This parable warns us to live intentionally, not assuming we have unlimited time.

In today's fast-paced world, it's easy to become complacent or distracted. But Jesus calls us to **keep our lamps burning**, staying watchful and spiritually alert at all times. Let this parable challenge and inspire you to examine your spiritual readiness and cultivate habits that keep you connected to God.

- 1 Peter 4:10 "Each of you should use whatever gift you have received to serve others..."







Day 2: 5 The Parable of the Talents

Devotional: Faithfulness in Stewardship Matters

The parable of the talents emphasizes the responsibility each believer has to use their gifts, resources, and opportunities wisely while waiting for Christ's return. The master entrusts different amounts to his servants, expecting them to invest and multiply what they've been given.

The servants who actively stewarded and multiplied their talents were praised and rewarded, while the servant who buried his talent out of fear was rebuked. This teaches us that *spiritual readiness includes faithful engagement and productivity*, not passivity.

God has entrusted each of us with unique gifts and responsibilities. It is not about how much one receives but what one does with it that counts. When Jesus comes back, He will evaluate how well we managed what was entrusted to us. Our readiness is shown by our faithfulness in the present.

Day 3: Name and Foolish Builders

Your Verse

Matthew 7:24-27 - "Therefore everyone who hears these words of mine and puts them into practice is like a wise man who built his house on the rock..."

Supporting Scriptures

- Luke 6:47–49 "Everyone who comes to me and hears my words and puts them into practice is like a man building a house..."
- 1 Corinthians 3:11 "For no one can lay any foundation other than the one already laid, which is Jesus Christ."







Day 3: Name and Foolish Builders

Devotional: Build Your Life on the Solid Rock

Jesus compares readiness for the future to building a house on a firm foundation. The wise builder hears Jesus' words and acts on them, securing his home against storms and trials. The foolish one ignores this, resulting in collapse.

Building on the rock symbolizes living according to Jesus' teachings, anchoring our lives in His truth and character. When the storms of life or the challenges of waiting come, those founded on Christ remain secure and prepared for His return.

This parable challenges us to self-examine our spiritual foundation. Are we building on shifting sands of temporary things or on the eternal rock of Jesus? Preparation means cultivating obedience, transformation, and a resilient faith.

Matthew 24:42–51 – "So you also must be ready, because the Son of Man will come at an hour when you do not expect him..."

Supporting Scriptures

- Mark 13:33 "Be on guard! Be alert! You do not know when that time will come."
- 1 Thessalonians 5:6 "So then, let us not be like others, who are asleep, but let us be awake and sober."







Devotional: Remain Faithful and Watchful Always

Jesus warns His followers to be watchful and faithful like the servant awaiting his master's return. The faithful servant is alert, doing his assigned duties diligently, while the unfaithful becomes complacent and mistreats others, unaware of the approaching master.

Spiritually, this calls us to vigilance—not only in looking forward to Jesus' return but in living responsibly and lovingly in the present. Watchfulness isn't just waiting but actively abiding in faith, love, and service.

Being ready means embracing a lifestyle of kingdom priorities, guarding against distractions, and loving others well. Our preparedness reflects our heart attitude toward Christ's promised return.

Devotional: Trust God's Timing in Readiness

The parable of the growing seed teaches us that readiness involves trust in God's sovereign timing. The farmer does his work of planting, but the growth happens mysteriously and naturally by God's grace.

Similarly, we prepare by faithfulness, but the fulfillment—such as Christ's return or spiritual growth—comes in God's perfect timing, not ours. This requires patience, persistence, and trust.

Waiting can be challenging, but this parable encourages us to rest assured that God's plans progress steadily. We remain responsible to sow and cultivate, while God ensures the increase.

Devotional: Readiness Shown Through Compassionate Action

The parable of the sheep and goats reveals that readiness is seen not only in belief but in how we actively love and serve others. The righteous are praised for meeting needs of the hungry, thirsty, stranger, and imprisoned — acts of mercy that honor Jesus.

This challenges us to examine if our faith translates into practical compassion. Waiting for Jesus' return is not passive but marked by loving deeds that demonstrate readiness and obedience.

Our preparedness is reflected in living out the gospel tangibly, reflecting Christ's heart to a hurting world while we await His coming.
