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Introduction

This study blends practical guidance with the reassurance of God's promises, helping you embrace the role of compassionate comforter, steady guide, and prayerful advocate.

Each day offers a focused passage, devotional insight, reflective questions, journaling prompts, and a heartfelt prayer. May this time deepen your faith, strengthen your parenting, and help you foster a safe, loving space where your child can express feelings, ask questions, and grow in trust.

Let the journey begin with the assurance that you are not alone—God Himself is tender toward the brokenhearted, and through you, His love can be reflected to your child.

Devotional: God's Comfort for Broken Hearts

Grief is a natural, yet heavy, part of human experience, even for children. We might want to shield our little ones from pain, but God's Word shows us that feelings of sorrow are real and deserve attention. Psalm 34:18 reminds us with powerful certainty that *the Lord Himself is close to the brokenhearted.* When children or parents feel crushed by loss, they are not abandoned or forgotten —God is right there, offering His comfort and peace.

Understanding grief through God's eyes helps us extend grace to ourselves and our children. It means recognizing that mourning can be a process of healing, not weakness. Jesus assures us that those who mourn are blessed because comfort will come, and Revelation paints a beautiful picture that one day all pain will vanish.

As you support your child today, remember that you are partnering with the God who heals, restores, and holds tenderly each tear. Encourage honest expression of feelings, and ensure your child feels safe to grieve while knowing God's nearness is unchanging.

- Jeremiah 29:11 "For I know the plans I have for you," declares the Lord.
- Isaiah 40:31 "Those who hope in the Lord will renew their strength."







Devotional: Anchoring Hope in God's Promises

Grief can sometimes dim the light of hope, especially for young hearts grappling to understand loss. Romans 15:13 encourages us to lean into God as the eternal source of hope, joy, and peace. When a child mourns, your role is to gently point them back to the God who holds all things in His hands and who has good plans for their future.

Hope is not just a wish but a confident trust in God's promises. Jeremiah reminds us that God's plans for us are filled with hope and a future. Through Isaiah, we learn that waiting on the Lord renews strength—something deeply needed during times of sorrow.

Help your child see beyond their current pain to the hope God offers. This hope can be built by reading Bible stories of God's faithfulness and praying together for peace. Keep hope alive by reminding your child that even in loss, God is working good things.

2.	How can you nurture hopeful thinking and faith in your child's heart?
	Are there verses or stories you might share regularly to reinforce God's promises?

2.	List scriptures or prayers to share with your child about hope.
3.	Describe how hope affects your parenting approach during grief.







Prayer for Today

Dear God, thank You for being the God of hope. Fill our hearts with joy and peace as we place our trust in You together. Help me to be a steady source of hope for my child, to guide their eyes toward Your plans that are good and full of future. Renew our strength and faith as we navigate this journey of grief, reminding us daily of Your unfailing love. *Amen.*

Your Verse

Supporting Scriptures

- Ecclesiastes 4:9 "Two are better than one..."
- Romans 12:15 "Rejoice with those who rejoice; mourn with those who mourn."







Day 3: Walking Together in Grief

Devotional: The Power of Shared Burdens

Grief can feel isolating, but God calls us into relationship and shared support.

Galatians 6:2 lovingly commands believers to carry each other's burdens, a calling that perfectly applies to parenthood. When a child suffers loss, your presence, empathy, and willingness to bear emotional weight alongside them exemplify Christ's love.

This does not mean having all the answers but simply walking together, being emotionally available, and validating your child's feelings. Ecclesiastes reminds us that companionship strengthens us, making heavy loads lighter. Romans exhorts us to share in both joy and sorrow, demonstrating that feeling deeply is part of what binds us.

Be intentional about creating safe spaces of connection with your child. Encourage open communication, gently ask how they're feeling, and remind them that grief is a journey best traveled together. Your faithful companionship is a gift reflecting God's heart.

Prayer for Today

Lord, thank You for reminding us to carry each other's burdens. Help me to walk closely with my child through grief, offering empathy and love as You do. Teach me to listen well and respond with patience and grace. Surround us both with community that uplifts and strengthens our hearts. May our shared experiences bring healing and deepen our trust in You. *Amen.* \heartsuit

Philippians 4:6-7 - "Do not be anxious about anything... and the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus."

Supporting Scriptures

- 1 Thessalonians 5:17 "Pray continually."
- Psalm 62:5 "Find rest in God alone; my hope comes from him."







Devotional: Prayer as Comfort and Peace

Prayer is a powerful tool to channel grief, calm restless hearts, and invite God's peace into our circumstances. Philippians 4:6–7 encourages believers not to be anxious but to bring all concerns to God through prayer. For parents helping children through loss, teaching prayer helps children connect directly with God, express emotions, and find unexplainable peace.

Encourage simple prayers of honesty with your child—whether thanking God, asking for help, or sharing sadness. Repeat the promise that God's peace will guard hearts and minds, even when feelings are overwhelming. 1 Thessalonians reminds us to pray continually, making communication with God a lifelong habit. Psalm 62:5 offers a beautiful invitation to rest in God alone.

Make prayer a daily rhythm, a place where grief can be brought into the light and met by God's loving presence. Together, you and your child can find strength to face each day.

3.	Reflect on how God's peace has manifested in difficult times.







Prayer for Today

Heavenly Father, thank You for the gift of prayer. Teach us to come to You with all our fears, sadness, and questions. Fill our hearts with Your peace that surpasses understanding and guard our minds in Christ Jesus. Help me lead my child in trusting You through every tear and every triumph. May prayer become a refuge and comfort for us both. *Amen.*















Your Verse

James 1:2-4 - "Consider it pure joy... whenever you face trials, because the testing of your faith produces perseverance."

Supporting Scriptures

- Psalm 46:1 "God is our refuge and strength, an ever-present help in trouble."
- 2 Corinthians 12:9 "My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness."







Devotional: Faith Builds Childlike Resilience

Parenting through grief involves helping children not only feel their pain but also grow resilient in their faith. James 1:2–4 illustrates that trials, including grief, are opportunities for perseverance and spiritual maturity. This doesn't mean minimizing the pain, but helping children understand that God is building strength within them even during hard times.

Psalm 46 assures us God is an ever-present help; you can remind your child that no matter how stormy life feels, God is their refuge. 2 Corinthians 12:9 emphasizes that God's grace is enough, especially in weakness—this is a comforting truth to share when children feel vulnerable or afraid.

Foster resilience by encouraging prayers for strength, sharing stories of biblical heroes who persevered, and affirming your child's courage day by day. Celebrate small victories—moments when faith overcomes fear. Through love and faith, your child can emerge from grief stronger and more rooted in God.







Reflect and Apply

What examples of perseverance can you recall from Scripture or personal experience?
How can you celebrate small acts of faith and courage in your child?
In what ways can you remind your child of God's strength amidst weakness?







Journaling Prompts

1.	Write about a time perseverance strengthened your faith during loss.
2.	List Bible stories of faith and resilience to share with your child.
3.	Reflect on how you can model resilient faith through this season.







Prayer for Today

Lord, thank You for making Your grace sufficient in our weakness. Help us view grief as a trial that can produce perseverance and deepen trust in You. Give me wisdom to nurture my child's faith, helping them grow resilient through every challenge. Ephesians 4:15 - "Speak the truth in love... growing in every way to Christ."

Supporting Scriptures

- Proverbs 3:5-6 "Trust in the Lord with all your heart... He will make your paths straight."
- John 8:32 "Then you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free."







Devotional: Truthful Love Builds Trust and Healing

One of the greatest gifts you can offer your child amidst grief is safe, honest conversation. Ephesians 4:15 calls us to speak truth in love, which means sharing feelings openly but tenderly, fostering trust and growth in Christ. Children need gentle honesty about death and loss—and encouragement to ask questions without fear of judgment.

Proverbs reminds us to trust God's guidance as we face uncertain paths. Honest conversations create clarity and freedom, trusting that God can handle our questions and fears, as John 8:32 promises truth leads to freedom.

Approach these talks with patience, be prepared to listen more than you speak, and never rush the process. Reassure your child that Faith can hold doubts and questions. Your truthful, loving presence will be a healing balm, helping them process and grow emotionally and spiritually.

2.	How can you balance honesty with sensitivity when discussing difficult topics?
3.	What questions might your child need space to ask, and how will you respond?

	Write about a time honest conversation led to healing or clarity in your life.
2.	List strategies for speaking truth in love with your child about loss.
3.	Reflect on your own fears or barriers to discussing grief openly.







Prayer for Today

Father, grant me courage and wisdom to speak truth in love to my child. Help me create a safe space where honest feelings and questions are welcomed. May Your Spirit guide every conversation, bringing healing and freedom through Your truth. Strengthen our relationship through open hearts and honest dialogue. *Amen.*

Devotional: God's Compassion Brings Daily Renewal

As this week of study closes, take heart in the daily renewal that God graciously offers. Lamentations 3:22–23 reminds us that God's compassion never fails and is new every morning. This truth holds great promise for parents and children navigating grief—it means each day offers fresh mercy, healing, and hope.

Isaiah assures us that no matter how deep the waters of sorrow, God is with us, walking beside us and our children every step. Psalm 147 reinforces that God actively heals and binds wounds, ministering gently to broken hearts.

Holding on to dieseps—a compass for weary souls. Embrace God's grace daily, knowing healing is a journey, not a quick fix. Celebrate progress, however small, and rest in the truth that God's love surrounds and restores your entire family.
