You will explore the wisdom of Proverbs, the encouragement of the Psalms, and the example of Christ's love to govern your parenting in this pivotal season.

releasing with purpose. It is an invitation to grow as a parent in new ways and to partner with God in shaping the next generation.

Your Verse

Ecclesiastes 3:1 - 'There is a time for everything, and a season for every activity under the heavens.'

Supporting Scriptures

- Psalm 127:3 'Children are a heritage from the Lord, offspring a reward from him.'
- Proverbs 22:6 'Start children off on the way they should go, and even when they are old they will not turn from it.'







Day 1: 7 Embracing God's Timing

Devotional: Trusting God's Timing in Parenting

Parenthood unfolds within God's perfect timing. Ecclesiastes 3:1 reminds us that every season has its purpose—a truth that is especially comforting when parenting young adults. The transition from childhood dependence to adult independence is often filled with mixed emotions. You may feel both pride and apprehension as your children seek their own paths.

Supporting Scriptures

- James 1:5 'If any of you lacks wisdom, you should ask God, who gives generously to all without finding fault, and it will be given to you.'
- Colossians 3:21 'Fathers, do not embitter your children, or they will become discouraged.'







Devotional: Parenting with Wisdom and Gentle Grace

As your young adults step toward independence, your role as a guide remains vital. Proverbs 3:5–6 urges us to trust God fully for wisdom in parenting. When your own understanding falls short, God's infinite wisdom is available to help you navigate challenges and decisions.

Guidance now looks different—it's less about control and more about gentle direction, encouragement, and grace. It's important to speak truth with love and avoid discouraging or embittering your children as Colossians 3:21 instructs. This balance allows your young adults to make mistakes, learn, and grow without fear of rejection.

Don't underestimate the power of prayer asking for wisdom, as James 1:5 encourages. Lean into God's Spirit to provide insight, patience, and clarity on how to walk beside your young adult without smothering their independence.

Wisdom-filled parenting fosters an environment where young adults feel supported yet free to pursue God's plans for their lives. Seek godly counsel, remain humble, and allow God's grace to shape your interactions.

Your Verse

Psalm 127:4-5 - 'Like arrows in the hands of a warrior are children born in one's youth. Blessed is the man whose quiver is full of them.'

Supporting Scriptures

- Isaiah 41:10 'So do not fear, for I am with you; do not be dismayed, for I am your God.'
- Philippians 1:6 'He who began a good work in you will carry it on to completion until the day of Christ Jesus.'







Day 3: 😂 Letting Go with Trust

Devotional: Releasing Control and Embracing Trust

Letting go of your young adult can feel like releasing an arrow from your quiver. Psalm 127:4–5 beautifully illustrates the blessing and responsibility of parenting, highlighting that the children you have raised are now empowered to launch forward into the world.

This release requires trust—trust in God's sovereignty and faithfulness. Isaiah 41:10 offers reassurance that God is with you and your child every step of the way, removing fear and providing courage. The parenting journey doesn't end with handing over the reins; instead, it's an ongoing partnership where God completes the work He began.

Remember that although your influence remains, you are not alone in this process. God promises in Philippians 1:6 that He is faithful to continue working in your child's life. So, as you lovingly let go, trust in God's purpose and provision for your young adult's future.

Releasing control doesn't mean losing love or involvement; it means embracing faith that God guides their path.

Your Verse

Proverbs 13:24 – 'Whoever spares the rod hates their children, but the one who loves their children is careful to discipline them.'

Supporting Scriptures

- Hebrews 12:11 'No discipline seems pleasant at the time, but painful. Later on, however, it produces a harvest of righteousness.'
- Ephesians 6:4 'Fathers, do not exasperate your children; instead, bring them up in the training and instruction of the Lord.'







Day 4: V Setting Boundaries with Love

Devotional: Loving Boundaries Shape Mature Faith

Even as young adults seek independence, healthy boundaries remain essential. Proverbs 13:24 reminds us that loving discipline is an act of care, not control. Setting clear, loving boundaries provides structure that helps young adults navigate choices responsibly.

This doesn't mean micromanaging their lives but rather lovingly communicating expectations and consequences rooted in godly love. Hebrews 12:11 acknowledges that discipline may feel difficult initially but ultimately yields spiritual growth and righteousness.

At the same time, Ephesians 6:4 warns against provoking frustration or anger in children. Boundaries should be set with sensitivity and respect, reflecting God's gentle instruction. This balance encourages maturity without rebellion or resentment.

Boundaries are gifts—even for young adults—as they learn to live independently within a framework of love and accountability.

Your Verse

1 Thessalonians 5:16–18 – 'Rejoice always, pray continually, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus.'

Supporting Scriptures

- Philippians 4:6 'Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God.'
- James 5:16 'The prayer of a righteous person is powerful and effective.'







Devotional: Powerful Prayer for Parenting and Release

Prayer is a powerful weapon and comfort for parents of young adults. As you release control, directing energy toward earnest, purposeful prayer sustains your heart and your child's growth. 1 Thessalonians 5:16–18 calls us to a constant posture of prayer, rejoicing, and thanksgiving.

Bring your concerns, hopes, and gratitude to God without anxiety, as Philippians 4:6 encourages. This consistent dialogue with God invites His peace into your heart amid uncertainty. Remember James 5:16's assurance that your prayers—born from a righteous heart—are mighty and effective.

Purposeful prayer strengthens your trust in God's plan and releases your young adult into His protection and guidance. It connects you spiritually even when you are physically apart or unable to control every detail.

Commit today to deepening your prayer life, focusing on God's promises and seeking His wisdom for each step your young adult takes.

Galatians 5:1 - 'It is for freedom that Christ has set us free. Stand firm, then, and do not let yourselves be burdened again by a yoke of slavery.'

Supporting Scriptures

- 2 Timothy 3:14–15 'Continue in what you have learned and have become convinced of, because you know those from whom you learned it.'
- Joshua 1:9 'Be strong and courageous. Do not be afraid; do not be discouraged, for the Lord your God will be with you wherever you go.'







Devotional: Empowering Spiritual Independence

Parenting young adults includes encouraging them to embrace the freedom Christ offers. Galatians 5:1 reminds us that in Christ, our children are liberated to live purposefully and freely.

Your role is to nurture their spiritual independence by encouraging them to stand firm in their faith, making personal decisions anchored in God's truth. As Paul advised Timothy (2 Timothy 3:14–15), your young adult must continue in the teachings they have received, owning their faith personally.

This freedom requires courage—a courage God promises to supply as Joshua 1:9 proclaims. Encouraging your children to live boldly for Christ while respecting their freedom fosters mature faith. This stage is not about controlling but empowering them to walk confidently with God.

Celebrate their spiritual milestones and gently guide them toward standing firm in faith as they step into adulthood.

- 1 Corinthians 13:4–7 'Love is patient, love is kind... It always protects, always trusts, always hopes, always perseveres.'







Devotional: Cherishing Mature Love and Connection

As your young adult steps into independence, your relationship enters a beautiful new season. Romans 12:10 encourages us to cultivate devotion and honor in relationships, moving toward mutual respect and friendship with our children.

Ecclesiastes 4:9-10 reminds us that strong relationships support resilience and growth. Your role shifts toward being a trusted ally and encourager, someone who can help lift up and celebrate joys and challenges alike.

1 Corinthians 13's description of love—patient, kind, protective, trusting, hopeful—guides this evolving relationship. Celebrate these qualities as you invest in a mature, loving connection with your young adult.

This is a time to enjoy the fruit of years invested and to engage with your child as a fellow traveler on life's journey. It's a new season to treasure and nurture with God's help.
