Devotional: God's Power Destroys Addiction Strongholds

Day 6: Honesty and Accountability

Confession breeds healing. When you confess your sins and struggles aloud to a trusted person, it breaks the power of secrecy and shame that fuels addiction.

Devotional: Protecting Your Heart Through Boundaries

Recovery involves learning to say no—setting clear boundaries to protect your heart and mind. Often, temptations arise from places or people that trigger addictive behaviors.

Psalm 101 reminds us to reject what is harmful and to distance ourselves from unfaithful influences. This can be hard, especially if these triggers have been a regular part of life.

Guarding your heart requires intentional choices on what and who you allow in. Boundaries create safe spaces where healing can grow and temptation loses power.

Today, prayerfully consider what boundaries you need to establish. It might mean avoiding certain environments, turning off devices, or saying no to invitations that could lead to temptation.
