John 14:27 - "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid."

Day 1: W Understanding God's Peace

Devotional: Grounding Your Calm in God's Peace

Peace begins with God. It is a gift from Jesus that sets us apart from the fleeting calm the world offers. When Jesus assured His disciples, "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you," He was promising a peace that comes from trusting in Him and His plans, not from our circumstances.

As we consider modeling peace for children, it's essential that we first grasp and rest in this divine peace ourselves. Children are perceptive; they notice when their adult role models are anxious or fearful. Our calm faith can only come from a heart anchored in God's peace.

How does this peace feel in your daily life? Is your mind often anxious or steady in trust? As you grow in your understanding of God's peace, you begin to create an atmosphere where children feel secure and learn to depend on God too.

Day 2: **B** Jesus, Our Model of Calm Faith

Devotional: Following Jesus in Peaceful Faith

Jesus shows us how to remain peaceful amid the storms of life. When the disciples panicked during the storm, Jesus responded with calm authority. His faith was anchored so deeply in His Father's will that fear had no place in His heart. This incident reveals that peace is not the absence of trouble; it is a reliance on God's power and goodness amid difficulties.

Children watch not only what we say but how we act when problems arise. By demonstrating calm faith like Jesus, we teach them to trust God's care and control. Jesus also empathizes with our weaknesses and offers help through all challenges. How might adopting Jesus' example influence your daily responses? How can you share this with children so they learn to invite Jesus into their own storms?

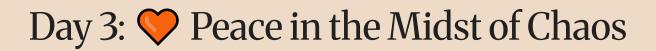
Prayer for Today

Day 3: Peace in the Midst of Chaos

Devotional: Choosing Prayer and Trust Over Anxiety

Life is often unpredictable and overwhelming, but peace is still possible. Paul encourages believers to replace anxiety with prayer, thanksgiving, and trust in God's care. This pathway leads to a peace that surpasses our understanding and actively guards our hearts and minds.

Modeling this approach to peace teaches children valuable habits for managing their emotions and fears. When they see adults turning worries into prayers and maintaining thankfulness, they learn to seek God's peace as their foundation.

Think about how you can invite children into these practices. How might you teach them to pray about their fears and find reassurance in God's ongoing presence? Remember, peace is a continual process — a choice to lean on God no matter the chaos around us.

Devotional: Fostering Peace Through Gentle Actions

Peace is cultivated not only in our hearts but also in the environments we create. Romans calls us to live at peace with others as much as it depends on us. This requires intentionality in how we speak, respond, and foster harmony.

For children, a peaceful home or community environment is vital. It allows them to thrive emotionally and spiritually. Demonstrating humility, patience, gentleness, and forgiveness sets a pattern of calm mindful living that children can imitate.

Devotional: Equipping Children to Live in God's Peace
