Your Verse

John 14:27 - "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid."

Supporting Scriptures

- Philippians 4:6-7 "Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus."
- Isaiah 26:3 "You will keep in perfect peace those whose minds are steadfast, because they trust in you."







Devotional: God's Peace Is a Gift Beyond Circumstances

As empty nesters face the quiet and space left by their growing children, uncertainty often creeps in. God's words in John 14:27 offer deep comfort:

Jesus gives a peace that the world cannot offer. This peace is not dependent on circumstances but is a gift rooted in His presence and promises. When the house feels emptier or roles feel less defined, remember that God's peace is a constant companion.

How can we access this peace? The answer lies in connection—with God Himself. Prayer, worship, and meditating on His Word open our hearts to receive His calming presence, even amid change. Philippians 4 reminds us we can cast our anxieties on Him and, in return, receive peace that "transcends all understanding." This peace guards our hearts when the future feels unknown.

Finally, Isaiah highlights that perfect peace comes when our minds remain steadfast, trusting God fully. This steadfast trust is especially vital when old rhythms dissolve and new ones begin to form. Today, invite God to fill the empty spaces with His unwavering peace.

	List three scripture verses or promises that encourage you regarding peace.
	Describe what God's peace looks like in your life right now—how does it show up?







Prayer for Today

Your Verse

Jeremiah 29:11 – "For I know the plans I have for you," declares the LORD, "plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future."

Supporting Scriptures

- Romans 8:28 "And we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him, who have been called according to his purpose."
- Isaiah 43:19 "See, I am doing a new thing! Now it springs up; do you not perceive it? I am making a way in the wilderness and streams in the wasteland."







Day 2: **B** Embracing God's Purpose in Change

Devotional: God's Good Plans Unfold in Every Season

Transitions can feel like uncharted territory, especially when lifelong roles change. The empty nest season may stir questions about identity and purpose. Yet, God's Word reassures us that He has a plan filled with hope and a future—for YOU. Jeremiah 29:11 reminds us God knows us intimately and has good plans, even if we don't immediately see them. This encouragement is vital as you step into a new rhythm.

Romans 8:28 encourages us that God works through all circumstances for the good of those who love Him. Even seasons of loss or emptiness are used by God to shape, refine, and redirect us toward His perfect will.

Further, Isaiah 43:19 announces God's ability to make 'a way' and bring new streams in the wilderness. This beautiful metaphor assures that God can turn dry, uncertain moments into places of refreshing and growth. As an empty nester, be open to the new things God is doing in your life—even if it feels unfamiliar or unexpected.

Prayer for Today

Your Verse

Psalm 4:8 - "In peace I will lie down and sleep, for you alone, LORD, make me dwell in safety."

Supporting Scriptures

- Psalm 91:1-2 "Whoever dwells in the shelter of the Most High will rest in the shadow of the Almighty. I will say of the LORD, 'He is my refuge and my fortress, my God, in whom I trust."
- Proverbs 3:5-6 "Trust in the LORD with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways submit to him, and he will make your paths straight."







Day 3: N Resting Securely in God's Protection

Devotional: Rest and Security Found in God's Care

One of the most tangible needs during transitions is security—knowing that we are safe and cared for despite changes. Psalm 4:8 captures the essence of resting securely in God's protection. There is profound peace in being able to lie down and sleep, free from fear, because God watches over us.

Psalm 91 further deepens this truth by describing God as our refuge and fortress. When the empty nest season stirs loneliness or uncertainty, hiding in God's 'shadow' reminds us that He is always nearby and mighty to protect.

Proverbs 3 encourages us to trust God wholeheartedly instead of relying solely on our understanding. This kind of trust allows us to submit our uncertainties and embrace God's leading. When we do this, we can be assured that He will direct our paths, making the journey smoother and more secure.

Today, consider what it means to rest and dwell in God's safety, especially when new experiences tempt you to worry.

Journaling Prompts

	Describe a time you experienced God's protection or peace in a stressful moment.
	Write down fears or doubts that you can bring to God and surrender today.
3.	Create a prayer of trust based on Proverbs 3:5-6 for this season.







Day 3: Nesting Securely in God's Protection

Prayer for Today

Loving God, thank You that You are my refuge and protector. Help me to rest in Your peace and safety even when life feels uncertain. Teach me to trust You completely and not lean on my own understanding. Guard my heart and mind, especially in quiet or vulnerable moments. Let me experience the deep rest You offer to all who dwell in You. *In Jesus' name, Amen.*

















Your Verse

Psalm 118:24 – "The LORD has done it this very day; let us rejoice today and be glad."

Supporting Scriptures

- Ecclesiastes 3:1 "There is a time for everything, and a season for every activity under the heavens."
- Isaiah 65:17 "See, I will create new heavens and a new earth. The former things will not be remembered, nor will they come to mind."







Devotional: Embracing Joy in God's New Seasons

Though the empty nest season often comes with loss, it also opens doors for fresh joy and new possibilities. Psalm 118:24 invites us to rejoice and be glad in the day God has made. This mindset reframes change not as just an ending but as a beginning ordained by God.

Ecclesiastes reminds us that life unfolds in seasons, each with its own purpose and beauty. Accepting this truth allows us to move gracefully through transitions rather than resisting or fearing them.

Isaiah paints a glorious future where God renews all things, encouraging us to look forward to the newness God is creating, both in us and around us. Even if the past was precious, the future holds God's promises of restoration and joy.

Today, reflect on how embracing joy in new beginnings can refresh your spirit and open you to God's good gifts in this season.

	How can I better recognize and celebrate the new opportunities God is bringing?
3.	What steps can I take to cultivate joy even when change feels difficult?







Journaling Prompts

1.	Write about a new beginning in your life for which you are thankful.
2.	List three ways you can intentionally choose joy today.
3.	Reflect on a past season of change where God brought renewal and hope.







Prayer for Today

Father God, thank You for the gift of each new day and the new beginnings You bring. Help me to rejoice in this present season and trust that You are at work making all things new. Give me eyes to see Your blessings, even in small moments, and a heart ready to embrace joy. May I celebrate Your goodness and rest in Your unfailing love. *In Jesus' name, Amen.*















Your Verse

2 Corinthians 5:7 - "For we live by faith, not by sight."

Supporting Scriptures

- Hebrews 11:1 "Now faith is confidence in what we hope for and assurance about what we do not see."
- Isaiah 41:10 "So do not fear, for I am with you; do not be dismayed, for I am your God. I will strengthen you and help you; I will uphold you with my righteous right hand."







Devotional: Faith Guides Us Peacefully Into the Future

The empty nest phase encourages us to walk forward with faith, trusting God even when the path ahead is unclear. 2 Corinthians 5:7 reminds us that our lives are guided by faith, not by what we can see or predict.

Hebrews enlarges this concept by defining faith as confidently hoping and being assured of things unseen. This faith anchors us when familiar routines fade and new seasons unfold.

Isaiah 41:10 offers a powerful promise: God will be with us, strengthening and upholding us amid uncertainties. God does not expect us to have all answers or perfect direction; He promises His presence, help, and strength every step of the way.

Today, choose to trust God's unfailing faithfulness as you face the unknown. Let peace fill your heart as you walk forward courageously by faith.







Reflect and Apply

1.	In what areas do I find it hardest to walk by faith rather than sight?
2.	How can God's promises encourage me to trust Him more fully today?
	What steps can I take to strengthen my faith during this season of change?







Journaling Prompts

1.	Write about a time when walking by faith led to peace or breakthrough.
2.	List fears you can hand over to God as you walk forward in faith.
3.	Compose a faith-centered verse or prayer to carry with you this week.







Prayer for Today
