#### Introduction

**Peace** is a treasure many teenagers long for in today's fast-paced and demanding world. This 5-day study is designed specifically for teenagers to explore how biblical peace works in real life. We will learn how peace is not simply the absence of trouble but a deep, abiding calm and confidence in God's presence and planespecially in the midst of stress, uncertainty, and pressure.

Each day, you will dive into Scripture passages that highlight different aspects of peace, from trusting God's control to calming anxious thoughts, and from living in harmony with others to anchoring your soul on Jesus. Through devotional reflections, personal questions, and prayer prompts, this study will help you discover practical ways to invite God's peace into your daily life, transforming how you respond to the challenges you encounter.

**Remember:** Peace is a gift God longs to give. By leaning on Him, teens can navigate school, friendships, future plans, and personal struggles with a calm faith that steadies your heart. Let's begin this journey toward a peace that can carry you through every pressure and bring quiet joy to your soul.

















#### Your Verse

John 14:27 - "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid."

#### **Supporting Scriptures**

- Isaiah 26:3 "You will keep in perfect peace those whose minds are steadfast, because they trust in you."
- Psalm 29:11 "The Lord gives strength to his people; the Lord blesses his people with peace."







#### Devotional: Jesus Gifts Us Unshakable Peace

What is real peace? Jesus speaks directly to our hearts in John 14:27, promising a peace unlike any other. The world offers peace based on circumstances, like a good test score or a fun weekend, but that peace fades quickly. God's peace is lasting because it doesn't depend on what happens around us—it rests in who He is.

As teenagers, you face many pressures—schoolwork, friends, family expectations, and self-doubt. These can easily trouble your heart and cause fear. But Jesus encourages you not to let worry win. Instead, He invites you to accept the peace He freely gives, a calmness rooted in faith that assures you are never alone and that God's plans for you are good.

**Try this today:** When anxious thoughts creep in, pause and remind yourself of Jesus' promise. Breathe deeply, and speak quietly to God, asking Him to fill you with His peace. Practice trusting Him more, knowing He holds your future and your present.

3.	Describe what it means to you to 'not be afraid' in the face of challenges.







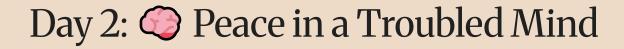
### Prayer for Today

#### Your Verse

Philippians 4:6-7 – "Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus."

- 2 Timothy 1:7 "For the Spirit God gave us does not make us timid, but gives us power, love and self-discipline."
- Psalm 94:19 "When anxiety was great within me, your consolation brought me joy."







#### Devotional: Prayer: The Pathway to a Peaceful Mind

Anxiety can overwhelm your mind and steal your peace, especially as a teenager facing many demands and uncertainties. But Scripture offers a powerful strategy: take your worries to God in prayer instead of letting them root in your thoughts.

Philippians 4:6-7 encourages us to bring everything to God—our fears, hopes, and needs—with a heart full of thanksgiving. When you replace anxious thoughts with honest prayers and gratitude, God's peace moves in. This peace is not just a quiet feeling; it actively "guards" your heart and mind like a protective shield.

Sometimes it's hard to stop the endless cycle of anxiety on your own. But you don't have to. The Holy Spirit empowers you with power, love, and self-control to face fear bravely, love others, and live with discipline. God's peace is your supernatural strength in stressful moments.

**Today's challenge:** Whenever you feel anxious, pause and pray through your worries. Thank God for His care and ask Him to guard your heart and mind. Notice how this practice can calm your soul and bring clarity amidst chaos.

#### **Supporting Scriptures**

- Ephesians 4:2-3 "Be completely humble and gentle; be patient, bearing with one another in love. Make every effort to keep the unity of the Spirit through the bond of peace."







### Devotional: Choosing Love and Patience Builds Peace

Peace isn't just an inward experience—it also shapes how you relate to others. As a teenager, friendships, family dynamics, and conflicts often influence your sense of well-being. Romans 12:18 reminds us that living peacefully with others is important and, as much as we can, we should pursue peace.

This doesn't mean always avoiding conflict, but rather approaching relationships with humility, patience, and love. Jesus calls peacemakers "children of God," showing that those who seek to bring peace reflect God's heart.

In daily life, this might look like listening carefully, forgiving quickly, or choosing kindness over anger—even when it's hard. These small acts of peace build trust and harmony, protecting your heart from bitterness and worry.

**Consider this today:** Are there relationships in your life that need peace and healing? Ask God to help you become a peacemaker, bringing calmness and love where there's tension. Remember, peace begins with your choices.

#### Your Verse

Psalm 34:17-18 - "The righteous cry out, and the Lord hears them; he delivers them from all their troubles. The Lord is close to the brokenhearted and saves those who are crushed in spirit."

#### **Supporting Scriptures**

- Isaiah 41:10 "So do not fear, for I am with you; do not be dismayed, for I am your God. I will strengthen you and help you; I will uphold you with my righteous right hand."
- Matthew 11:28 "Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest."







### Devotional: God's Nearness Brings Peace in Pain

Life's storms—whether it's pain, disappointment, or tough seasons—can feel overwhelming. But even in the hardest times, God's peace doesn't abandon you. Psalm 34:17–18 reminds us that God listens to our cries and draws near when we feel broken or crushed.

When you feel weighed down by troubles, God invites you to lean on Him. Isaiah 41:10 declares He will strengthen and uphold you. Jesus promises rest for the weary in Matthew 11:28. Peace isn't denial of hardship; it's trusting God's presence and power to carry you through.

Remember, it's okay to feel sad or discouraged—God welcomes your honest emotions. His peace comes as you draw close, letting Him comfort and renew your spirit, even in pain.

**Today's encouragement:** If you're facing a storm, bring it honestly before God. Ask Him to be your strength and to fill you with peace that sustains. Rest in the hope that you're not alone and that He is faithful to bring you through.

Day 5: 🞇 Anchored Peace in Jesus

#### Devotional: Christ's Peace Rules Your Heart and Life

Wrapping up our study, today we center on the source and ruler of lasting peace—Jesus Christ himself. Colossians 3:15 encourages believers to let Christ's peace govern your heart, making peace a guiding force even when life is challenging.

As part of God's family, you are called to live in peace with others, but equally to let His peace anchor your soul internally. Through Jesus' victory over the world's troubles (John 16:33), you receive strength and hope to face difficulties calmly.

Hebrews reminds us that God equips you with all you need to do His good will. When you submit your daily life to Jesus and thank Him often, His peace becomes a powerful ruler over your fears and distractions.

**Final step:** Open your heart to Jesus daily. Choose to let His peace rule your thoughts, actions, and emotions. Be thankful for this gift of peace and pass it on by living with calm faith amidst life's pressures.
