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#### Introduction

#### Your Verse

Philippians 4:6-7 – "Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus."

#### Supporting Scriptures

- Isaiah 26:3 "You will keep in perfect peace those whose minds are steadfast, because they trust in you."
- John 14:27 "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid."







#### Devotional: God's Peace Guards Our Caregiver Hearts

Caregiving often brings anxiety and uncertainty. Whether it's managing medical appointments, emotional outbursts, or physical exhaustion, the stress can feel overwhelming. However, God calls us to bring all our concerns to Him through prayer and thanksgiving. *Instead of letting anxiety control our hearts, we can invite the peace of God to guard our hearts and minds.*

## Devotional: Cultivating Patience and Grace in Caregiving

Scripture reminds us to clothe ourselves with compassion and kindness, embodying the gentle love God models toward us.

## Devotional: Seeking God's Wisdom and Strength Daily

## Devotional: Finding Rest and Renewal in God's Presence
