Think about areas where you struggle to wait patiently. Invite the Holy Spirit to produce patience, shaping your character and increasing your peace.

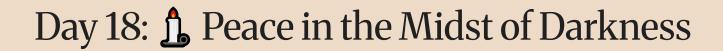
