John 14:27 - Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid.

- Philippians 4:6 Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God.
- Isaiah 41:10 So do not fear, for I am with you; do not be dismayed, for I am your God.







Devotional: God's Peace Is a Gift, Not Circumstantial

Your Verse

Day 2: • God's Sovereignty over Our Future

Devotional: Trusting God Beyond Our Comprehension

Your Verse

Matthew 6:25-27 - Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat or drink; or about your body, what you will wear. Is not life more than food, and the body more than clothes? Look at the birds of the air; they do not sow or reap or store away in barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not much more valuable than they? Can any one of you by worrying add a single hour to your life?

Supporting Scriptures

- Psalm 55:22 Cast your cares on the Lord and he will sustain you; he will never let the righteous be shaken.
- Philippians 4:19 And my God will meet all your needs according to the riches of his glory in Christ Jesus.







Devotional: Letting Go of Worry Through God's Care

Fear about the future often presents itself as worry, especially over our basic needs. Jesus addresses this in Matthew 6, encouraging us to observe how God provides for the birds and flowers—greater than us in value.

When we rest in God's provision, we admit that He is in control and capable of meeting all our needs. Worry cannot add a single hour to our lives, but trusting God invites peace and security.

Psalm 55:22 reminds us to cast our burdens on the Lord because He sustains us. We are invited to truly lay down our anxious thoughts and believe that God's riches in Christ are sufficient for whatever we need.

Today, consider what anxieties you need to release and let God's faithful provision restore your peace.

- 2 Peter 3:8-9 The Lord is not slow in keeping his promise, as some understand slowness. He is patient, not wanting anyone to perish but everyone to come to repentance.







Devotional: Trusting God's Perfect Timing

Waiting on God's timing can be one of the hardest parts of trusting His plan. Ecclesiastes 3:1 reminds us that everything has its appointed season. Even when we do not see it, God is working according to His perfect clock.

Habakkuk 2:3 assures us that God's promises will come to pass at the right moment, without fail. And 2 Peter 3:8–9 shows us God's patience, desiring good for us and for others, not rushing or delaying without purpose.

Day 6: A Walking by Faith, Not by Sight

Devotional: Faith Sustains Us Through the Unknown

Fear often arises because we focus on what we see and don't see. 2 Corinthians 5:7 reminds us that our daily walk is by faith—trusting God beyond visible evidence.
