Devotional: Embracing God's Peace Over Graduation Fears

Supporting Scriptures

- 1 Peter 5:7 "Cast all your anxiety on him because he cares for you."

Day 3: • Overcoming Anxiety Through Prayer

Devotional: Finding Peace by Casting Anxiety on God

It's easy to feel overwhelmed when transitioning out of school. The pressure, the choices, the unknowns—it can all feel heavy. But Paul's letter to the Philippians teaches a powerful remedy for anxiety: prayer, thanksgiving, and trusting God.

Philippians 4:6-7 invites us to bring all our worries directly to God. When we do, He provides a peace that goes beyond human understanding. This peace acts like a guard, protecting our hearts and minds from fear and stress.

1 Peter 5:7 reminds you that you are not alone in your struggles—God deeply cares about every concern you have. And Jesus' words in Matthew 6:34 encourage you not to borrow trouble from tomorrow.

When anxiety creeps in, pause and turn to prayer. Give thanks for what God has done and trust Him to carry your burdens. This practice can transform your mindset and infuse your graduation season with calming assurance.

Devotional: Courageous Steps Fueled by God's Presence

Joshua 1:9 is a powerful command and promise combined—God tells Joshua, and therefore us, not just to be brave but to remember God's ever–present companionship.
