Our identity begins with the truth that God created and loves us uniquely.

Psalm 139:13-14 paints a beautiful picture of God as the intimate Creator who knows us intimately, having formed our inmost being with care. This reality invites us to see ourselves not as accidents or mistakes but as wonderfully made works of art.

Jeremiah 1:5 affirms before our birth, God knew and set us apart for a purpose. Ephesians 2:10 continues this truth explaining our lives have meaning as God's handiwork designed for good works in Christ.

Knowing you are beautifully created and loved gives peace amid self-doubt or comparisons. When you start your day remembering that the God of the universe chose to craft you with care, your value is secure. His love is the foundation of your identity.

Day 3: V Secure in God's Acceptance

Your Verse

Supporting Scriptures

- Hebrews 10:14 "For by one sacrifice he has made perfect forever those who are being made holy."

Day 4: Besting in Christ's Finished Work

Devotional: Freedom Through Christ's Complete Sacrifice

Peace grows from understanding that Christ's sacrifice completely covers our sins. Colossians 2:13–14 powerfully reminds us that God canceled all charges against us, nailing them to the cross. This is the foundation of our freedom and identity.
