Your Verse

John 14:27 – "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid."

Supporting Scriptures

- Philippians 4:7 "And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus."
- Isaiah 26:3 "You will keep in perfect peace those whose minds are steadfast, because they trust in you."







Devotional: Receiving the Gift of True Peace

Peace is a divine gift that Jesus offers us freely, one that is unlike anything the world can provide. In John 14:27, Jesus assures His followers that His peace is enduring and calming, intended to replace fear and worry. This peace comes not from circumstances but from confidence in God's presence and promises.

Living free from clutter begins with embracing this peace internally. When our hearts are troubled by busyness or distraction, Jesus invites us to rest in Him. Philippians 4:7 reminds us that God's peace protects our hearts and minds, giving clarity amidst chaos. Isaiah 26:3 shows the link between steadfast trust and perfect peace.

As you begin this study, consider what worries or mental clutter rob you of peace. **Prayerfully invite Jesus to give you His calm, and be open to releasing your burdens.** The journey to living simply begins by receiving His peace.

Day 2: O Prioritizing What Matters

Your Verse

Matthew 6:33 – "But seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well."

Supporting Scriptures

- 1 Timothy 6:6-8 "But godliness with contentment is great gain. For we brought nothing into the world, and we can take nothing out of it."
- Hebrews 12:1 "Let us throw off everything that hinders and the sin that so easily entangles. And let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us."







Day 2: O Prioritizing What Matters

Devotional: Simplifying by Seeking God First

Simplicity grows when we make God our priority. Jesus teaches clearly in Matthew 6:33 that when we seek God's kingdom first, He provides for our needs. This means intentionally arranging our lives to pursue what truly lasts instead of accumulating distractions.

1 Timothy 6:6-8 reminds us that contentment—being satisfied with what we have—is a great gain and key to living simply. Clutter often accumulates from desire for more, but godliness paired with contentment frees us from this trap.

Hebrews 12:1 urges us to remove hindrances and sins that entangle us, so we can run our race with focus. Clearing out distractions, whether material possessions or unhelpful habits, opens the way for God's peace to flourish.

Take time today to reflect on deliberate actions you can take to seek God first and remove what hinders your peace and simplicity.

Day 3: Letting Go of Excess

Your Verse

Ecclesiastes 4:6 - "Better one handful with tranquility than two handfuls with toil and chasing after the wind."

Supporting Scriptures

- Luke 12:15 "Watch out! Be on your guard against all kinds of greed; life does not consist in an abundance of possessions."
- Psalm 34:14 "Turn from evil and do good; seek peace and pursue it."







Day 3: Day 3: Letting Go of Excess

Devotional: Choosing Tranquility Over Excess

More is not always better. Ecclesiastes 4:6 reminds us that tranquility—peace of mind—is more valuable than increasing possessions through exhausting effort. Many times, the pursuit of 'more' distracts us from the peace God offers.

Jesus warns against greed in Luke 12:15, emphasizing that life's true value does not come from abundance but from trust and simplicity. When we let go of excess, we open space for contentment and divine peace.

Psalm 34:14 encourages us to actively seek peace and pursue it, rejecting evil inclinations that disrupt it. This includes cutting ties with unnecessary clutter that burdens our hearts or homes.

Today, reflect on material and emotional excess in your life. What can you realistically let go of to create room for simplicity and peace? This may be possessions, unhealthy relationships, or burdensome commitments.

God, give me courage to release what I do not need and to stop chasing after empty pursuits. Help me embrace tranquility over turmoil and trust that You provide enough. Teach me to seek peace in You above all things and to live simply with a grateful heart. *Thank You for filling my life with Your calm presence.* Amen.

Your Verse

Psalm 46:10 – "Be still, and know that I am God; I will be exalted among the nations, I will be exalted in the earth."

Supporting Scriptures

- Matthew 11:28 "Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest."
- Isaiah 30:15 "In repentance and rest is your salvation, in quietness and trust is your strength."







Day 4: Besting in God's Presence

Devotional: Finding Peace Through Stillness and Trust

True peace blooms in moments of stillness with God. Psalm 46:10 invites us to be still and recognize God's sovereignty, a powerful prescription for an overwhelmed soul. In a cluttered world, cultivating intentional silence allows us to connect deeply with Him and rest in His power.

Jesus extends an open invitation in Matthew 11:28 to all who are weary, promising rest. This rest isn't just physical but spiritual—a restful peace that renewing our hearts and minds.

Isaiah 30:15 connects rest, quietness, and trust with salvation and strength. When we pause, repent, and trust God fully, we tap into His sustaining peace that carries us through life's demands.

Today, set aside time to be still before God. Notice how resting in His presence creates simplicity and peace where there was once burden.

Philippians 4:11-13 - "I have learned to be content whatever the circumstances... I can do all this through him who gives me strength."

Supporting Scriptures

- Colossians 3:15 "Let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, since as members of one body you were called to peace."
- 1 Peter 3:10 "Whoever would love life and see good days must keep their tongue from evil and their lips from deceitful speech."







Devotional: Contentment and Peace Rooted in Christ

Contentment brought by Christ sustains our peace and joy. Paul's words in Philippians 4:11-13 reveal a powerful secret to living simply and joyfully: relying on Christ's strength and learning to be content in every situation.

When peace rules our hearts, as Colossians 3:15 encourages, it guides our attitudes, decisions, and interactions. This peace is not dependent on external circumstances but rooted in the unity we have in Christ.

Living simply also includes guarding our speech and thoughts (1 Peter 3:10), nourishing relationships that foster peace rather than conflict. Such choices multiply the joy that comes from a life aligned with God.

As this study concludes, embrace the journey of simplicity with hearts full of Christ's peace and joy. Remember, His strength empowers you every step of the way.
