#### Devotional: Embracing the Peace Jesus Offers

Day 2: BGuided by the Spirit's Peace

#### Your Verse

Galatians 5:22–23 – "But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, forbearance, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control."

#### **Supporting Scriptures**

- Romans 8:14 "For those who are led by the Spirit of God are the children of God."
- Isaiah 26:3 "You will keep in perfect peace those whose minds are steadfast, because they trust in you."







Day 2: **B** Guided by the Spirit's Peace

#### Devotional: Allowing the Spirit to Lead to Peace

The Holy Spirit's work in our lives produces peace as one of His fruit.

Galatians 5:22–23 shows us that peace is not something we manufacture alone but a result of living under the Spirit's guidance. When we submit to Him, allowing Him to lead our decisions, reactions, and attitudes, peace flourishes naturally.

God calls us not only to receive peace but also to walk in it daily. Romans 8:14 makes it clear that being led by the Spirit marks us as God's own children. When we cultivate a close relationship with the Spirit, our minds become steadfast, and perfect peace is the outcome (Isaiah 26:3).

Day 3: **(b)** Peace Amidst Life's Trials

#### Your Verse

John 16:33 – "I have told you these things, so that in me you may have peace. In this world you will have trouble. But take heart! I have overcome the world."

#### **Supporting Scriptures**

- 2 Corinthians 12:9 "My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness."
- Psalm 46:1 "God is our refuge and strength, an ever-present help in trouble."







Day 3: Peace Amidst Life's Trials

#### Devotional: Finding Peace When Life Is Difficult

Peace through the Holy Spirit is not a promise of trouble-free living, but of strength and calm in the midst of trials. Jesus reminds us in John 16:33 that although we will face hardships, we can have peace because He has overcome the world. This peace is a profound assurance that whatever challenges come, we are not alone or defeated.

#### Devotional: Peace as the Foundation for Unity

Colossians 3:15 calls us to let Christ's peace rule our hearts because we are called to live in harmony as one body.
