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#### Introduction

Throughout this plan, you will engage with Scripture, prayer, and reflection to understand how Peter's denial reveals the nature of human frailty alongside divine mercy. Each day builds upon the last, guiding you to grapple with personal obstacles, embrace repentance, and receive God's restoration. By journey's end, you will not only understand Peter's story more deeply but also see your own story through God's lens of grace and healing.

This study is a call to courage and hope, reminding you that no failure is beyond God's redeeming power. Let the story of Peter encourage you to confess your weaknesses honestly, trust God's forgiving heart, and step boldly into restoration, empowered by His Spirit.

#### Devotional: When Fear Leads to Failure

Peter was brave and bold—yet on this night, fear overwhelmed him. When Jesus was arrested, Peter followed at a distance but denied knowing Him three times, fulfilling Jesus' earlier prophecy. This moment reveals a deeply human response: when confronted with danger or rejection, even the strongest believers can falter.

Why did Peter deny Jesus? Fear for his own safety. The pressure of the crowd and authorities threatened to consume him. Peter's denial is not just a story of failure but a reminder that fear can disconnect us from our faith and courage.

Peter's actions also show us something hopeful: despite his failure, he was near Jesus during the most difficult moments. His heart was still connected, even if his words were not. This story invites us to honestly examine our own fears and moments of weak faith, knowing that God sees and understands us deeply.

As you reflect today, consider how fear challenges your walk with Christ and what it means to remain close to Him, even in the storm.


