#### Devotional: Opening Your Home as a Healing Space

Your home can be a sanctuary for those who are hurting or seeking connection. Romans 12 encourages believers to practice hospitality as an act of sharing and caring deeply for one another. As a single person, you have a unique gift—a flexible schedule and a space that can simply be a refuge of peace and fellowship.

The early church in Acts 2 demonstrates hospitality's power in building true community. Meeting regularly in homes, believers experienced healing, encouragement, and unity. # Devotional: Investing Time Wisely Through Hospitality

# Devotional: Serving Christ Through Welcoming Others

Hospitality is ultimately an act of serving Christ Himself. In Matthew 25, Jesus teaches that when we care for others' needs—feeding the hungry, welcoming the stranger—we are doing it directly to Him. This profound truth gives deep purpose to your hospitality as a single believer.

Serving others humbly and with love reflects the heart of Jesus' example. He came not to be served but to serve, and calls us to emulate that same attitude. Whether inviting a friend over for a meal or offering practical help, you are ministering to Christ in those moments.

Today's challenge is to view your hospitality as more than social interaction—as sacred service. Ask God to prepare your heart and hands to meet needs, showing Christ's love tangibly. Your single life is an expression of your devotion and can glorify God one act of kindness at a time.

- 1 Timothy 3:2 "Now the overseer is to be above reproach, faithful to his wife, temperate, self-controlled, respectable, hospitable..."
- 3 John 1:5-6 "Dear friend, you are faithful in what you are doing for the brothers and sisters, even though they are strangers to you."
