Devotional: Seeking Wisdom with a Humble Heart

King Solomon's prayer in 1 Kings 3:9 reveals a heart eager to lead with wisdom rather than selfish gain. When God offered to grant him anything he wanted, Solomon chose wisely, asking for a discerning heart to govern God's people justly. This prayer teaches us an important truth: God values a humble request for wisdom over riches or long life.

Solomon's willingness to seek wisdom shows that true leadership begins with dependence on God's guidance. Devotional: Trusting God's Generous Wisdom

It begins with reverence for God—'the fear of the Lord'—which is a deep respect and awe that recognizes His power and holiness. This reverence transforms our hearts and grounds us in understanding.

As you continue to pray for wisdom, remember to place your trust fully in Him, committing every decision to His guidance. When we rely on God rather than ourselves, He promises to direct our paths and provide clarity beyond what we can imagine.

Day 3: Walking in Wisdom Daily



Your Verse

Proverbs 3:5-6 - "Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways submit to him, and he will make your paths straight."

Supporting Scriptures

- *Colossians 1:9 - "We continually ask God to fill you with the knowledge of his will through all the wisdom and understanding that the Spirit gives."*
- *Psalms 37:5 - "Commit your way to the Lord; trust in him and he will do this."*



Devotional: Commit to Walking Wisely Each Day

Wisdom is a journey, not just a one-time gift. Proverbs 3:5-6 teaches us the discipline of daily trust and submission to God. To 'lean not on your own understanding' means to set aside our limited perspective and rely fully on God's unfailing knowledge.

Living wisely requires continual commitment to God's direction. Paul prayed that believers would be filled with the knowledge of God's will through the Spirit's wisdom and understanding. This tells us wisdom is linked closely to ongoing relationship with God through the Holy Spirit.

As you pray for wisdom like Solomon, also ask God to help you walk in that wisdom every day. Commit your plans, your choices, and your life to Him fully and watch how He makes your path straight even in uncertain times.



Reflect and Apply

1. How can daily trust and submission to God transform your decision-making?

2. In what ways are you currently leaning on your own understanding instead of God's?

3. What practical steps can you take to commit your ways fully to the Lord?



Journaling Prompts

1. Write a prayer committing specific areas of your life to God's guidance.

2. Reflect on how the Holy Spirit has helped you understand God's will recently.

3. List habits or routines that can help you remember to seek God's wisdom daily.
