Your Verse

1 Corinthians 7:34 - "There is a difference between a married woman and a virgin. The unmarried woman cares about the Lord's affairs—how she can please the Lord."

Devotional: Your Identity Is Complete in Christ Alone

Devotional: Singleness as a Season to Pursue God's Calling

Ephesians 2:10 affirms you are God's handiwork, created intentionally for good works prepared in advance. Devotional: Learning Joyful Contentment in Every Season

Contentment is a choice and a fruit of spiritual maturity, especially in the season of singleness. Paul's teaching in Philippians 4:11–12 reveals how he learned to be content regardless of his situation — whether in abundance or want. This example shows us that true joy is not found in circumstances but in God's sustaining grace.

1 Timothy 6:6 reminds us that godliness accompanied by contentment is invaluable. Contentment does not mean settling for less or lacking ambition but trusting God's provision and timing fully. It allows you to embrace your current season of singleness with peace rather than longing or frustration.
