Devotional: Discovering the Purpose in Singleness

Singleness is not a default state or a waiting room—it is a distinct calling with its own opportunities. Paul's words in 1 Corinthians remind us that an unmarried person can fully focus on serving the Lord without the divided interests that come with marriage. This freedom is not about isolation but about being freed up to invest deeply in God's kingdom and others around us. *Your present status does not limit what God can do through you.* Psalm 68 reminds us that God provides connection and purpose even when we feel alone. This encourages us to see singleness as a season where God places us intentionally to fulfill His plans.

One of the blessings of singleness is the flexibility it offers. Without the added responsibilities of family life, you can often respond quickly and enthusiastically to ministry needs. Romans encourages us to serve the Lord with zeal and fervor, and your season of singleness is an ideal time to embody this.

Jesus commended Mary for choosing to focus on Him rather than being distracted by other duties. Similarly, your ability to prioritize God's presence and calling allows you to engage deeply in ministry. Paul's example of devotion shows how serving can be both an offering and a sacrifice that pleases God.

Consider how you might use your flexibility to help in areas others cannot. Could you volunteer for last-minute opportunities? Lead new outreach initiatives? Your availability is a gift that can enable ministries to flourish.
