Devotional: The Peace of God's Righteousness Over Wealth

Proverbs 15:16 poses a stark but beautiful contrast: the calm and peace that comes from fearing the Lord but having little, versus the chaos and unrest that can accompany great wealth without righteousness. The pursuit of worldly gain often promises happiness but frequently delivers stress, temptation, and spiritual emptiness.

In *Matthew 6:33*, Jesus calls us to prioritize God's kingdom and righteousness first. This is not a denial of blessings or provision but a realignment of our hearts. When righteousness leads, our needs are met in God's perfect timing and way.

Devotional: Heavenly Wisdom Guides Us Away from Greed

Wisdom is more valuable than gold because it guides us on the path of righteousness. **James 3:17** describes heavenly wisdom as pure, peace-loving, merciful, and sincere. This wisdom helps us discern what truly enriches our lives beyond material possessions.

Proverbs 3:13 praises those who find wisdom and understanding as truly blessed. Earthly wealth is fleeting and often leaves the soul wanting more, as noted in *Ecclesiastes 5:10*. The relentless pursuit of money rarely fills the deeper longings of the heart.

Today, ask God for His wisdom to rightly evaluate what you value. Wisdom from above opens our eyes to eternal treasures and empowers us to reject worldly temptations. Let this wisdom shape your choices, so that you find true richness in God's character and purposes.

Devotional: Treasuring God Above Earthly Possessions
