This moment was not just about physical blindness but also about spiritual awakening — God was opening Saul's eyes to a new truth.

Think about the unexpected ways God might be trying to reach you. Saul's encounter reminds us that God can break through our routines and preconceived ideas to reveal Himself. Often, transformation begins with a divine interruption that challenges what we know and believe.

God's grace is active and powerful. It meets us exactly where we are—even when we think we are farthest away.

Devotional: Spiritual Growth Through Divine Weakness

After the encounter, Saul was blind—physically unable to see, but spiritually awakening. This period of blindness was a divine pause, a necessary time of reflection and dependence on God. It is a reminder that sometimes God allows seasons of emptiness or uncertainty to prepare us for what's next.

Spiritual growth is often accompanied by seasons of discomfort. During these times, God's grace is especially important because our own strength falls short. Saul's blindness forced him to rely fully on God's power rather than his own abilities.

This teaches us humility and dependence on the Lord as we navigate our own journeys of transformation.
