#### Devotional: Laying the Spiritual Foundation Early

#### Devotional: Living Integrity for Our Children to See

#### Devotional: Discipline: Love's Correction toward Integrity

**Discipline is an expression of love.** Raising children in integrity requires boundaries and guidance rooted in care and correction. God disciplines because He loves, and likewise, as parents, our discipline helps children learn right from wrong, shape self-control, and build character.

Discipline is not about punishment alone but about training with a heart focused on their growth and well-being. This balance of love and correction builds trust and teaches children that integrity often requires hard but necessary choices.

#### Devotional: Cultivating Ownership of Actions

When children learn to work diligently and accept correction, they develop character that perseveres and thrives.
