Day 1: The Call to Rebuild









Your Verse

Haggai 1:7-8 - "This is what the LORD Almighty says: 'Give careful thought to your ways. Go up into the mountains and bring down timber and build my house, so that I may take pleasure in it and be honored,' says the LORD."

Supporting Scriptures

- Nehemiah 2:18 "They replied, 'Let us start rebuilding.' So they began this good work.
- Zechariah 1:16 "Therefore this is what the LORD Almighty says: 'I am very jealous for Zion; I am burning with jealously for her.'"







Devotional: Prioritizing God's Work in Our Lives

Haggai's initial message to the people was a direct challenge to consider their current priorities. After returning from exile, many had focused on their own homes and comfort while neglecting the rebuilding of the temple, the house of the Lord. God's call was clear: to give careful thought to their ways and make rebuilding His house the foremost task.

In our own lives, this passage invites us to reflect: Are we dedicating ourselves to God's purposes, or are we distracted by personal ambitions and comforts? The temple represented the presence of God among His people; similarly, our lives are to be living temples where God dwells. When we ignore His call, we risk spiritual stagnation and miss out on the blessings He wants to pour out.

Taking action in faith, just as the Israelites did by gathering timber and starting the rebuilding, represents obedience. It requires courage to redirect our energies and to rebuild areas that may feel broken or neglected. This day challenges us to prioritize what truly honors God, trusting that He will take pleasure in our efforts and be glorified through our obedience.

Consider how you can begin rebuilding in your spiritual life today.

Day 2: (b) The Promise of God's Presence

Your Verse

Haggai 2:4 - "But now be strong, Zerubbabel,' declares the LORD, 'be strong, Joshua son of Jozadak, the high priest, and be strong, all you people of the land,' declares the LORD, 'work. For I am with you,' declares the LORD Almighty."

Supporting Scriptures

- Isaiah 41:10 "So do not fear, for I am with you; do not be dismayed, for I am your God."
- Matthew 28:20 "And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age."







Day 2: 6 The Promise of God's Presence

Devotional: Strengthened by God's Faithful Presence

After calling the people to rebuild, God offers His powerful encouragement: 'Be strong!' Zerubbabel, Joshua, and all the returned exiles are reminded that they do not labor alone because God is with them. This assurance is a vital cornerstone for anyone undertaking difficult or discouraging tasks.

Life's challenges can make us feel isolated or overwhelmed, especially when spiritual growth or service feels slow or unrewarded. Haggai's message reminds us that God's presence empowers us to persevere. He is our strength and refuge, accompanying us every step of the way.

Reflect on the significance of God's promise "I am with you." This is not only a comforting phrase but a divine empowerment to act boldly and faithfully. When we rely on God's presence, our work—no matter how challenging or small—takes on eternal significance.

Be encouraged today to embrace God's abiding presence as you rebuild faith, relationships, or ministries in your life.

Your Verse

Haggai 2:19 - "Is not this the day when I declared that I would bless you? And now the blessing comes, so do not fear."

Supporting Scriptures

- Deuteronomy 28:2 "All these blessings will come on you and accompany you if you obey the LORD your God."
- Psalm 128:1 "Blessed are all who fear the LORD, who walk in obedience to him."







Day 3: **B** The Blessings of Obedience

Devotional: Experiencing God's Blessings Through Obedience

The final encouragement in Haggai reminds us that obedience brings blessing. As the people responded to God's call and resumed rebuilding, He reassured them that His blessings would accompany their obedience. God calls us today to that same posture of trust — when we prioritize His plans and walk in faithful obedience, blessings follow.

These blessings are not always immediately visible or material; they may include peace, spiritual growth, strengthened relationships, and deeper joy. God's promise to 'not fear' is a call to trust that despite uncertainties, His goodness and provision are sure.

Obedience is an active choice—one that invites God's favor and allows His purposes to unfold in our lives. Reflect on the ways you have experienced God's blessings after acts of faithfulness and obedience. Let this inspire you to continue rebuilding your life around His word and will.

Embrace today's promise: God's blessings come when we keep turning back to Him in faith and obedience.
